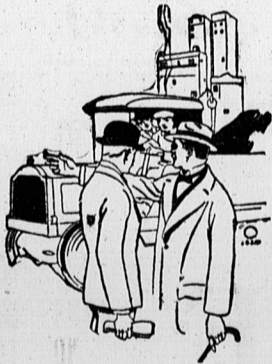

—BOARD OF TRADE.—The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade was held in the Town Hall Thursday evening, a large number of members being present. Mr. T. D. Ramsay was chairman for the evening. The two chief questions brought up before the Board were the arrangements for receiving the American Press Association and the car ferry question. There is about to be built a powerful ice breaker to keep the St. Lawrence River open, which will cost about \$2,000,000 and estimated to have 8,000 horse power. Quite a discussion arose as to whether it would be of greater benefit to the Island to combine this breaker with a car ferry to use in case of emergency should the present car ferry be disabled at any time. A motion that this subject be left to the Railway Committee to look into the matter and give all necessary information was moved by Mr. H. J. Holman, and seconded by Mr. W. J. Lidstone and Mr. R. J. McDonald, unanimously supported by the members.
