Stock Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, Jan. 16 — (CP) — Sizable export business in Canadian grains was reported today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.
CHICAGO, Jan. 16 — (CP) — Mill buyers of wheat and reports of government demand for flour steadied the grain futures today after an easy start. The trade in all plus registered fractionally lower shortly after the opening.
LONDON, Jan. 16 — (CP) — Sentiment on the Stock Markets today was again cheerful but business was rather less active than recently.
Interest was centered chiefly in industrials with investment support appearing for brewery shares. Textiles met some provincial inquiry and occasionally gained three pence while there was some demand for iron and steel.

MONTREAL, Jan. 16 — (CP) — Securities drifted mostly along a narrow path in business today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market and trading tone was quiet after the briskness that marked transactions in the first two weeks of the new year. Industrials, papers and golds were pushed up a bit in the indices and utilities were unchanged.
NEW YORK, Jan. 16 — (AP) — A few rails and industrial specialties took a turn on the recovery side of today's Stock Market although many leaders were unable to attract worthwhile support.
Tending to cool bullishness was the move of the S & C to abolish floor trading by Stock Exchange members for their own account. A restriction of this was the sale of a seat on the big board for \$61,000, off \$4,000 from a previous transaction on Dec. 4.
The Associated Press 60-stock average was unchanged at 59.3.

TORONTO, Jan. 16 — (CP) — The gold stocks came to the front in the final hour of today's trading on the Toronto Exchange and they turned a noon index loss into a net advance of 34. The Base Metal and western oil stocks finished on the down side.
Trading in Chertsville on 4 a strong price on the advanced the day's proceedings. It traded 88,700 shares on a report that the one was improving in depth and climbed to 82 25. The close at 2:20 was up 29 cents net. Trading in Ohrlin was another feature. It gained 14 cents on trade of 18,000 shares and closed at 2.262. Closing prices were up 10 cents or more for Amor, Bear, Upper Canada, Lamaque and San Antonio.

"TIGHTS" is a good word to describe the close-fitting, moisture-proof wrapping now being used to protect gun barrels, radio parts and even fully assembled automatic weapons for delivery to our troops on the invasion beaches and in the field. Thus packed, stores can be safely put ashore through the surf and, if necessary, stored in the open.

In the case of automatic weapons, the heavy black grease formerly used is no longer required. Instead, the mechanism and barrels are lightly lubricated and all the soldier need do is to strip off the covering, clamp on the magazine, and the gun is ready to fire.

There are several types of this interesting wrapping, each with its own specific use. One is of cotton sheeting combined with "Cellophane" and coated with wax. It is strong, tough, impervious to sea water, rain, mud.

The use of "Cellophane" in this way is an example of how this familiar transparent wrapping material is being combined with other substances to meet and overcome new shipping problems. It also demonstrates another way in which Industrial Chemistry is helping in the war.

NOTICE TO LANDLORDS AND TENANTS OF COMMERCIAL ACCOMMODATION
Concerning Term Certain Leases Expiring May 1, 1945

- If the landlord of any commercial accommodation now occupied by a tenant wishes to occupy the accommodation himself on May 1, 1945, he should immediately apply to the Rentals Office of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board for permission to give notice to vacate to the tenant. Such notice to be effective must be given before February 1, 1945.
- Any notice from the landlord that may have been given prior to January 2, 1945, refusing to renew the lease is null and void. Any such notice given subsequent to that date without the permission of the Rentals Appraiser is likewise null and void.
- Landlords of tenanted commercial accommodation who, before January 2, 1945, have entered into a contract to give vacant possession thereof on May 1, 1945, to a third party, should apply for clearance to the Rentals Office of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board.
- With effect January 2, 1945, no well-behaved tenant of commercial accommodation can be required to vacate without permission of a Rentals Appraiser of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, or without a clearance from the Rentals Administrator, which permission or clearance will be granted under the following circumstances:—
 - The landlord desires the accommodation for his own personal occupancy for a period of at least a year.
 - The landlord desires the accommodation for purposes of demolition or major alterations.
 - The landlord desires the accommodation to be converted into housing accommodation.
 - The landlord has prior to January 2, 1945, entered into a bona fide contract to give vacant possession of the accommodation to a third party.
