Mr. Dillon's recitations were worthy of a professional, and the various choruses were rendered with the dash and vim so characteristic of the sailor.

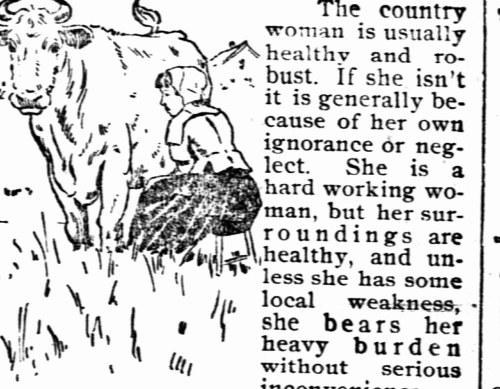
The thanks of the Georgetown people are due to the performers for their kind assistance.

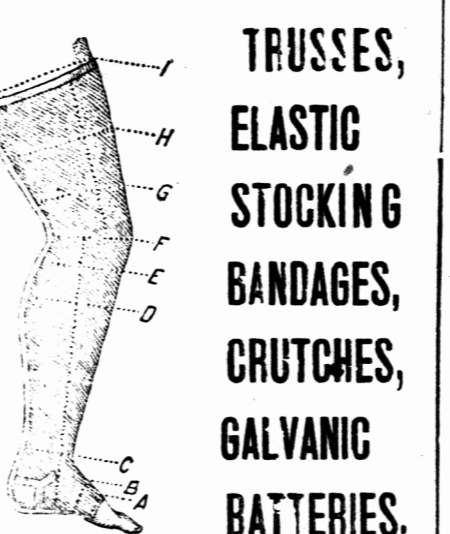
