SHE TELLS HOW MR. O'SULLIVAN "PROPOSED"?

Specifications Filed by Mrs. Lee in Breach of Promise Case

BOSTON, Jan. 9.—Attorney Granville S. Macfarland, representing Mrs. Isabelle M. Lee, who figures as the plaintiff in a \$100,000 breach of promise suit against Humphrey O'Sullivan, the well known rubber heel manufacturer, yesterday filed the specifications relative to the time, place and language used by Mr. O'Sullivan in his proposal of marriage which Mrs. Lee alleges he made.

This is the result of an order made by Judge Gaskill of the Superior Court several days ago, compelling Mrs. Lee to file her specifications.

As all of the papers in the case have been impounded by order of the court, none of the evidence set forth in the papers filed yesterday will be made public until the case comes up for trial.

"This precaution was taken," said Mr. Macfarland, "simply because the details are so scandalous that they could not be exposed to the public gaze."

"We have set out to prove that Mr. O'Sullivan did promise Mrs. Lee to marry her, that Mrs. Lee thought that Mr. O'Sullivan was free to make a promise of this kind, and that Mrs. Lee suffered injury through Mr. O'Sullivan's deception; and I am firmly convinced that we will succeed in proving all our contentions beyond a doubt."

Many letters are attached to the bill which are alleged to have been written by O'Sullivan to Mrs. Lee, and every phase of the case which caused such a sensation a few weeks ago is described in full detail.
