SIGNS OF THE TIMES.

No leader of the Liberal party in Canada ever deserved more honor from his country than the late Alexander Mackenzie.

The Pacific Scandal had carried into the Liberal ranks for the moment a large number of electors and not a few representatives who had no real affinity for Liberal principles or their new party associations.

The wily Conservative leader, Sir John Macdonald, raised the new issue of the National Policy and it caught the ear of the country.

Without greater merit, but with an able aggregate of ministers, the Laurier administration has been much more fortunate than that of Mr. Mackenzie.

The result is shown in the by-elections. It is no longer the Conservative newspapers that publish the long list of by-elections carried and of seats redeemed from the enemy.

Conservative candidates. The large balance of seats has fallen to the Liberals, including seven or eight which went Conservative in the general election of 1896.

Many readers will recall the name of Miss Flora Shaw, the correspondent of the London Times, whose letters from the Klondyke impeaching the Canadian officials attracted some attention a few weeks ago.

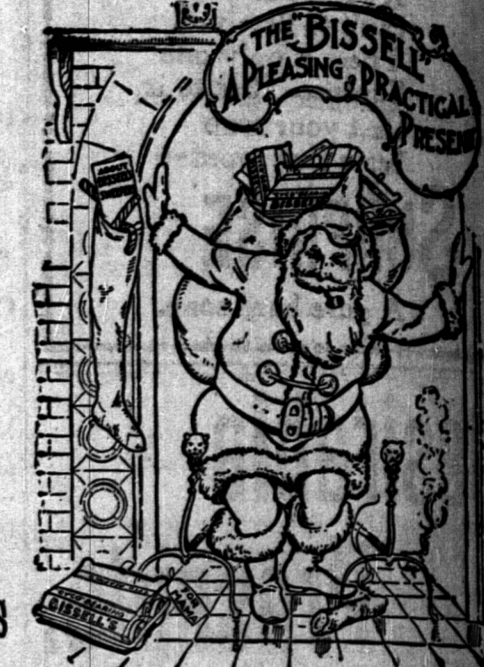

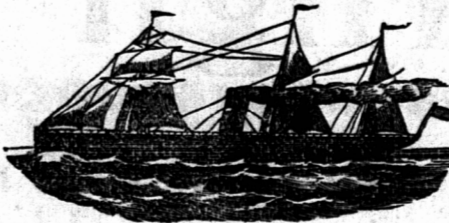
