LONDON, Nov. 26. (Special)—Supported by a large force of her "People's Army," Miss Sylvia Pankhurst addressed a meeting at Bow on Sunday afternoon and then marched under the escort of the army from the hall to her residence. No attempt was made to arrest her.

The strictest precaution had been taken to exclude detectives from the hall, and throughout the proceedings Miss Pankhurst looked nervously alert, clucking at her chair at the slightest noise.

Miss Zelle Emerson, of Jackson, Mich., also made an address.

Incendiary outrages by the suffragettes occurred Saturday, the boat-house at Bastville Park, Bristol, and a portion of the grandstand in the sports ground at Blackburn being burned.

LATEST REPORT ON PANAMA CANAL

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26. (Special)—That the opening of the Panama Canal on January 1, 1915, is not yet an absolute certainty, is stated by Colonel George W. Goethals in the annual report of the Isthmian Canal Commission, made public here today. Additional slides may delay the date. The impression generally held that the blowing up of Gambia Dike and the flooding of Culebra cut mean that the canal is practically completed is erroneous, according to this report. Culebra cut was flooded to allow suction dredges to attack the slides.

The report outlines the policy to be followed by the canal authorities in dealing with individuals or corporations desiring to sell coal or oil fuel to vessels using the canal. The government will allow storage space and handle the coal, charging for this service. The supplies of fuel to be stored for naval purposes will be used to maintain uniform prices. Comment regarding the form of government to be adopted for the zone after the completion of the canal, which is said to have caused a break between Colonel George W. Goethals and Richard Lee, Metcalf, of the Canal Commission, is absent from the report.

CHIEF POINTS IN REPORT The chief points in the report are as follows:—

Opening of the Canal may be delayed longer than January 1, 1915, if new slides occur.

Already 22,570,200 cubic yards of earth and rock have slid into the Culebra cut, 2,304,200 cubic yards more than was estimated for last year.

Blowing up of the Gambia dike on October 10 was only a step toward the completion of the great waterway. Passage of merchant vessels depends on the dragging of a channel through fifty acres of the slide.

Coal and oil will be stored on the Isthmus by the government for the use of the navy and to maintain uniform prices to merchant vessels.

The total amount paid out by the disbursing officer on pay rolls aggregated \$20,524,705.75, in addition to which \$9,035,630.18 were paid out in settlement of public bills and on reimbursement vouchers.

Congress has appropriated a total of \$349,508,233.14 for canal construction, including appropriations contained in the act of June 23, 1913. Of this amount \$10,676,950 were for fortifications.

GERMANY AND PANAMA CANAL

BERLIN, Nov. 26. (Special)—Germany above all other foreign nations expects to profit by the opening of the Panama Canal. Maritime experts here say that while the United States naturally will receive the greatest advantage, owing to its lack of vessel it will not be in a position to profit by the great increase in the carrying trade which the German ship owners have foreseen and prepared for.

Orders placed by three of the leading German companies for new vessels designed particularly for service by way of Panama, large increases of capital stock by the same companies and the announcement that the four big lines now running to the Orient, Australasia and the Pacific coasts of North and South America will be diverted to pass through the canal as soon as it is open, to commerce speak plainly of the importance attributed in this country to the new waterway.

German authorities say that the effect of the opening of the canal will manifest itself chiefly in a great commercial boom in Western Canada and the Pacific Coast States, from which shipping interests generally will profit in increased freights as a result of the opening of hitherto undeveloped or slightly developed States on the western coast of South America stored with raw material; in the diversion and expansion of the streams of European emigration to regions on the Pacific coast well suited to settlement, but of which the European emigrant hitherto has had slight knowledge; and, finally, in the opportunity offered to the industries of the United States to compete under highly favorable conditions in the markets of the Orient, Western South America, Australia and New Zealand.
