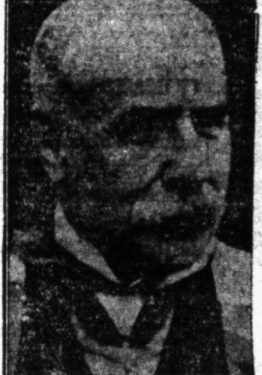
SECURES POWER

## PEACE REIGNS THROUGHOUT AUSTRIA

Threatened Restoration of Hapsburgs Presents New Menace to Country.

(By Wade Werner Associated Press Foreign Staff by Guardian's Special Wire)  
VIENNA, Feb. 28.—A half dozen bombs burst in Vienna today and several Nazi flags were unfurled in the provinces, but the explosion of a Nazi leader's ultimatum to Chancellor Dollfus' Government was marked by comparative peace.

University of Vienna students went about their work peacefully. There were no street gatherings. Officials and others, to all appearances, continued their tasks of reconstruction, following a sanguinary Socialist uprising and days of turbulence.

Against Restoration  
Czechoslovakia, however, was entirely reassured by the Prince's remarks, especially his advocacy of repealing laws banishing the Hapsburgs from Austria and confiscating their property.
