CANADIANS IN BRAZILIAN JAIL EXPECT CHOLERA OUTBREAK

HACKENSACK, N. J., July 30.—Twenty men mostly Canadians, are in prison awaiting trial in Brazil charged with taking part in a filibustering expedition which they were going to join in the belief that they were going to protect a gold mine, according to Mrs. Leonora Vice, who has just returned from visiting her son, one of the prisoners, who was shot by the police. The expedition was under Sebastian Magali, who chartered a vessel and sailed from Brooklyn, his purpose being to land on the coast of Brazil and overpower the government forces.

TEAM LAUNCH TOTALLY WRECKED

HIGHLAND LIGHT, Mass., July 31.—A twenty-five foot steam launch, in charge of Charles Ekholm, from Boston, bound for New York was driven into the breakers and totally wrecked half way between Cahoon's Hollow and Nauset life saving stations late today. Captain Walaer of the Nauset station pulled Ekholm out of the surf and later succeeded in saving the engine of the boat.

A TRIP IN THE CLOUDS

Clayton, who went up for the purpose of taking observations to ascertain if there is a warm tide current above the earth. They landed this evening in Munroe, six miles from here, after an uneventful trip.

ABLE MURDER UGHTED IN N.Y.

NEW YORK, Aug. 1.—In the finding early today of the half-charred body of a young woman in an isolated section of Williamsburg, Brooklyn, one of the most atrocious and cunningly planned murders that has been given to the police to solve in many years was revealed.
