DISCUSSING THE INTERCOLONIAL.

On Monday last the House of Commons devoted the best part of the day to a discussion of the future of the Intercolonial. The question arose on a motion of Mr. Mackenzie of Cape Breton that the time has come to extend the Government road in Nova Scotia to those counties that are yet without railways. He specified Guysboro, Richmond, Victoria, Inverness and the south of Cape Breton, and pointed out that Nova Scotia was the one Province of the mainland that was not traversed by the Transcontinental. A half dozen Nova Scotia and New Brunswick members spoke to the motion, including Mr. Sinclair of Guysboro, Mr. McDonald of Pictou and Mr. Emerson of Westmorland.

None of these were quite satisfied with present conditions. One or two hinted that things might be better under company management. Generally the opinions expressed favored the taking over by lease or purchase of a number of branch lines. Hon. Mr. Graham, the Minister of Railways, began an elaborate speech, during which he intimated that the acquisition of branch lines had already engaged the consideration of the Government and would be again taken up when Mr. Fielding returns from his vacation. All indications point to something being done in the near future toward a further extension of the I. C. R. system by taking over branch lines, especially in Nova Scotia.

WHY NOT A PLEBISCITE ON RECIPROCITY?

Speaking of the proposal to submit the navy question to the test of a plebiscite, Toronto Saturday Night sees no particular objection thereto, but suggests that at the same time the question of reciprocity should also be submitted to the votes of the people. But it opines that the protected interests would be very reluctant to do this. They are conducting a very vigorous campaign against reciprocity and against tariff reduction in any form, contending that the people do not want either of these things. They have even, it is said, bought newspapers to aid in their campaign.

Surely there is as much reason for

a plebiscite on the reciprocity question as on the navy question and there is very little doubt, in our mind at least, as to how the majority would vote on the former, however they might decide upon the latter question. The great mass of the farming and consuming population of Canada, nearly 75 per cent. of the whole, want to buy where they can get the best value, and sell where they can get the highest price. If the anti-reciprocity interests really believed the people were with them they would be only too glad to have the question settled by a plebiscite. But they are hardly prepared to trust the people so far as that.

THE QUESTION OF REVENUE.

The opponents of reciprocity and of tariff reduction are perpetually putting forward the argument that Canada must have a revenue, and where is it to come from if the duties are reduced? The fact is if the duties were made high enough to be prohibitory on all dutiable articles there would be no revenue at all, and many Canadian duties are far too high to produce the largest amount of revenue attainable.

Public Notice

As measles seem to be getting prevalent in the schools of Charlottetown owing to the neglect of some citizens, public notice is called to the Regulations of the Board of Health, especially to Rules 1 and 6. Rule 1 states that any householder in whose house occurs a case of measles shall immediately notify the Board of Health, through its Health Officer or secretary, of the same. Rule 6 states that no member of any household where measles exists shall be permitted to mingle with children in schools, churches, or other public places. There is a penalty of \$40.00 for failure to obey the rules. The Board of Health requests all citizens to comply with the regulations at once, and assist in stamping out the disease. W. W.
