TORONTO, June 26—(CP)—Gold stocks registered a moderate recovery in today's trade on the Toronto exchange while the industrial weakened slightly and the base metal and western oil stocks had insignificant index losses. Volume was around the recent average at 132,000 shares.

COCONUT FUDGE CHEWS

2 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted
1-2 cup melted butter
2 eggs, well-beaten
1 cup sugar
1-2 teaspoon vanilla
3-4 cup sifted cake flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1-4 teaspoon salt
1 cup shredded coconut
METHOD: Melt the chocolate over hot water, then stir in the melted butter and blend well. Beat the eggs thoroughly and gradually beat in the sugar. Combine this chocolate-butter and egg-sugar mixture and add the vanilla. Sift the cake flour and the baking powder and salt. Add to the first mixture and stir until well-blended. Add the coconut last. Spread the mixture in a greased shallow pan and bake in a modern oven (350 deg. F.) for 35 minutes. Remove from oven, allow to cool slightly, then cut in squares or oblongs and cool these on a cake rack. Store in a closely covered container. You will find that these have a nice glaze on top when baked.
