-There were about thirty passengers going and fifty returning by the Empress to Summerside, yesterday.
-Ronald Campbell, Summerside, left by the Empress yesterday morning on a business trip to Campbellton, N. B.
-Dealers in Alberton yesterday were paying 18c. per pound for butter, 15c a dozen for eggs, 8c a lb for pork, 50c a bus. for oats, 29 a ton for hay, 7c a lb for hides, 25c. a bus for potatoes and 20c a lb for wool.
-Justice Fitzgerald, J. A. Matlison, Mr. Croskill, and others who attended the Supreme Court in Summerside returned home Saturday to spend Sunday in Charlottetown. They returned Monday morning to be present at opening of court.
-The engagement is announced of Miss Edyth Carrie Hoyle, daughter of W. H. Hoyle, M. P., and Mrs. Hoyle, Westward Ho, Cannington, Ont., to Dr. Emerson McNeill, Qu Appelle, Saskia. The marriage will take place in June—Mail and Empire, Toronto. Dr. McNeill is a son of M. A. McNeill, Alberton.
-The case of D. R. Morrison vs. the Summerside and Commission, which has been before the Court since last Wednesday, was concluded yesterday morning. The Judge, in his charge to the jury, eliminated all but two items of the total amount claimed, these being \$159.10 for lead pipe, and \$132.06 for not receiving orders from the Commission in time, as per contract. At twelve o'clock the jury brought in a verdict for the plaintiff for \$291.16. The defendants had previously paid nearly \$200.00 to Court.
