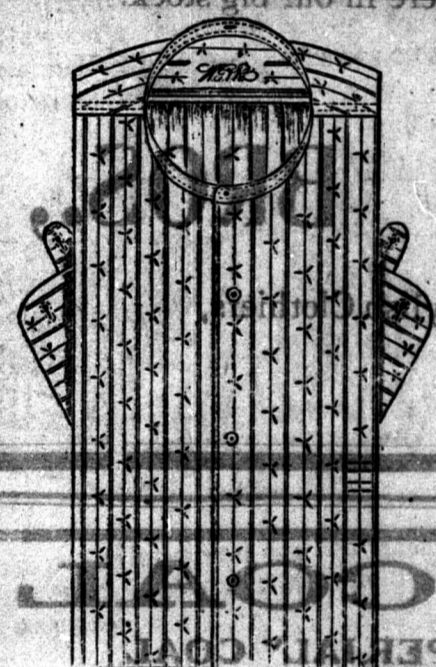

SKETCHES OF THE LIVES OF THE JURISTS IN THE GAMEY CASE

Sir John Alexander Boyd was the son of the late John Boyd, who was for many years the principal of Bay Street Academy, Toronto. He was born here on April 23, 1837. He was educated at Upper Canada College, where he obtained a scholarship and won the modern language gold medal when graduating in 1860. In the following year he proceeded to his M.A. degree and was subsequently for a number of years one of the University examiners. He adopted law as a profession and was called to the bar in 1865. After practicing for a time with D. B. Read, Q. C., he entered the firm of Blake & Kerr, where he continued until appointed Master in Chancery. Later



per Canada. He matriculated with a general proficiency scholarship in Toronto University in 1862. His course at the University was one of rather universal distinction, inasmuch as there was hardly any department in the curriculum in which he did not at some period obtain first-class honors. After winning college prizes and university scholarships in each year, he graduated B. A. in 1866, with the gold medal for Modern Languages, and proceeded to the M.A. degree in 1871. On leaving university he filled for a year the chair of Modern Languages in Yarmouth, N.S., Seminary, and returned to Toronto on being appointed lecturer in Italian and Spanish in University College, which position he occupied for one year. In 1868 he commenced the study of law and was called to the bar in 1871. During the whole of his career at the bar Mr. Falconbridge was a member of one of the largest and most eminent legal firms in Canada, that originally known under the name of Harrison, Osler and Moss, and the experience gained by him therein was of so wide a character as to add



greatly to his natural qualifications for a seat on the bench. He was an examiner in the University of Toronto for several years and became registrar of the University in 1872. He resigned that office in 1881 and was immediately elected as senator. He was re-elected in 1886 and resigned from the board in 1896, because he would not countenance the action of the Senate in conferring an honorary degree on Prof. Goldwin Smith. He was elected a member of the Law Society in 1885 and was in the same year created a Q.C. by the Marquis of Lansdowne. He was appointed a judge of the Queen's Bench in 1887 and was named a commissioner for the revision of the Ontario statutes in 1896.
