FRANCE AND JAPAN BACKED BRITAIN

The Three Nations Stick to Each Other--Loyal Support at the Wireless Conference--Surprise to Delegates --The Status of Wireless Telegraphy.

BERLIN, Nov. 5.—In the International Wireless Telegraph Conference, which finished its work Thursday, Great Britain succeeded in making the American proposal for unrestricted exchanges of messages between ship and shore and ship and shore, regardless of the system used, a separate article.

Throughout the conference Great Britain was loyally backed by France, Italy and Japan, the French delegates often supporting the British delegates against their own convictions. Italy, from the first, confessed herself intricately hampered by her contracts with the Marconi Company.

The motion of the United States to make intercommunication between ship and shore compulsory came as a complete surprise to the conference, and was described as a regular bombshell. The German government was not particularly pleased with it, but accepted the motion after some hesitation.

Great Britain opposed it, out of consideration for the demands of traffic, on the ground that it was impracticable, besides being an improper restriction to place upon individuals. France, Italy and Japan supported Great Britain, but the motion was carried.

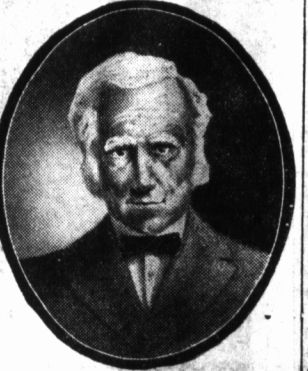
A further proposal by the United States to make the motion binding of all the signatory powers, which was also opposed by Great Britain, was rejected by the Conference, and a British proposal to make the American motion a separate article, to which the powers signing the convention need not necessarily adhere, was passed.

The convention, if all goes well, will go into force of July 1, 1908. It is understood that, with regard to Article XVII. of the draft, the conclusion is that the only way of settling the question of imposing the convention upon private wireless telegraph companies will be by the introduction of special legislation by each State.

FISHERMAN USE WIRELESS PHONE

LONDON, Nov. 6.—A despatch to the "Morning Leader" from Copenhagen says that a lieutenant of the Swedish army, after four years' experimenting, has invented a complete wireless telephone. Swedish newspapers state that there will be a public demonstration of the invention in December.

MARSHFIELD, Mass., Nov. 6.—The wireless telephone, it is claimed, has successfully entered into the deep sea fishing industry. For the past week experiments have been conducted by the wireless telegraph station at Brant Rock, which is equipped with a wireless telephone, with a small vessel stationed among the fleet of the South shore fishermen, twelve miles out in Massachusetts Bay. Recently it is asserted, the fishermen wished to learn the price ruling in the Boston market. The operator on the wireless fitted boat called up Brant Rock and phoned the fishermen's request. The land operator asked Boston by wire and the answer was forwarded to the fishermen.

NAVAL OUTBREAK AT PORTSMOUTH

PORTSMOUTH, England, Nov. 6.—A mutinous outbreak on the part of five or six hundred sailors last night necessitated the immediate mobilization of the entire force in the naval barracks here in order to prevent the affair from developing into a serious mutiny. The men had assembled in the gymnasium when the senior officer, a man of short stature, wishing to administer a reprimand for breach of discipline, ordered the front ranks to kneel so that he could see the men in the rear. The order was resented and some of the sailors who refused to obey were arrested. Their comrades, aggrieved, ran amuck, wrecked the canteen and other premises, started to break out of the barracks with the intention of wrecking the quarters of the obnoxious officer, and were only prevented from so doing by the fixed bayonets of an overwhelming force. A number of men who attempted to break out of barracks were arrested.

RUBBERS

FATALLY WOUNDED IN RACE RIOTS

HATTIESBURG, Miss., Nov. 5.—Two men were fatally wounded and over 50 who's were fired in a race riot at Wiggins, Miss., 35 miles south of here, Sunday afternoon and night.

William Smith, a negro, resisted arrest and fired on Marshal Quarrels and Deputy Mitchell, the latter receiving a fatal wound in the head. Smith escaped to his home, barricaded the doors and defied capture until a mob threatened to burn the house. After surrendering, he was locked in the village jail. Late last night a mob dynamited the jail, fired several volleys into his cell and left him for dead. While the mob was storming the jail a large crowd of negroes came upon the scene and began firing into the ranks of the besiegers. Over 500 shots were exchanged, and D. M. Clark, a white man, was fatally injured. Several negroes are supposed to have been shot, but so far the total number of casualties has not been learned. This morning Smith was found alive in the jail, but his arms had to be amputated.
