FROM OVERSEAS.—Mrs. J. M. Godfrey, who not long since returned from overseas, where she was serving as a nurse, is at the Queen, in Halifax. A host of friends, both here and in her native province of Prince Edward Island, will regret to hear that her husband, Dr Godfrey, R. A. M. C., is now in a hospital at Dover, having been wounded in action, says a Halifax exchange.

ST. JAMES PRAYER MEETING.—Prayer meeting in St. James Hall this evening at 8 O'clock.

REV. J. E. WILSON DEAD.—The death occurred in Woodstock, N. B. on Sunday Nov. 3rd, after three weeks illness of pneumonia and kidney trouble, of Rev. J.E. Wilson, the popular pastor of the United Baptist Church of that place and President of the Maritime Baptist Association. He is survived by his wife and two children to whom loving sympathy is extended.

SUPREME COURT.—The Michaelmas Term of the Supreme Court opened yesterday with three Judges on the Bench. In the case of Ahearn vs Doyle, an action for damages, tried at Summerside in June last before the Chief Justice without a jury judgment was given for the plaintiff for \$36. In the case of Edward Burke vs William Burke, tried at Georgetown in July last before Mr. Justice Hazard without a jury, judgment of nonsuit was given. The case of Schurman vs. the Trustees of St. James' Church is now being argued for a new trial before the Court.

GOOD BRIDGE AT PINETTE.—One of the latest improvements of the country is the building of a new bridge across the South Pinette River. The construction is based upon concrete piles driven down to hard bottom, across each bunch of piles a hard pine cap is placed. The span is about 30 feet long and 16 feet wide, the spurs beams are steel and the covering is of hemlock. Over all is a wire rail reaching from end to end over approaches and span. The work was undertaken by Mr. E. Poirier, of Abram's Village, who is favorably known all over the province as being very expert in this line of work. He completed the work in about 40 days with 10 workmen. Mr. Poirier also built the North Pinette Bridge three years ago, which is similar in type to the one at South Pinette. This bridge is as square and level today as when built. Mr. Poirier's friends and acquaintances in Pinette wish him every success in his work.

CALLED TO THE BAR.—Yesterday Mr. Mark R. McGuigan was called to the Bar of this province having made an exceedingly good showing in his examination. The Chief Justice congratulated Mr. McGuigan on his high marks and wished him a fortunate career in his practice as a barrister. Mr. McGuigan has been a student-at-law the past four years in the office of Messrs McKinnon & McNeill, of this city. He is a son of Mr. Peter P. McGuigan of Hope River who is widely known in Queen's County. Congratulations are extended to this talented young lawyer and the hope expressed that he will maintain the traditions and the high honors that have been won by members of the Bar of our Island province.

XMAS PARCELS.—There was a large attendance at the meeting of the P. E. I. Artillery Auxilliary held at the Y. M. C. A. Monday evening. The general tone of the meeting was one of thankfulness for the good news of the past few weeks. It was decided to send Christmas parcels containing cake and chocolates to the Artillerymen overseas on Thursday the 14th inst. These men have done their part in the great battles of the past months and the Auxilliary are particularly anxious to make these Christmas parcels the best ever sent and they would ask all who are interested in making this Christmas as bright as possible for the boys overseas to help them in this work. The secretary, Hazel J. Stewart, will gladly acknowledge all contributions.

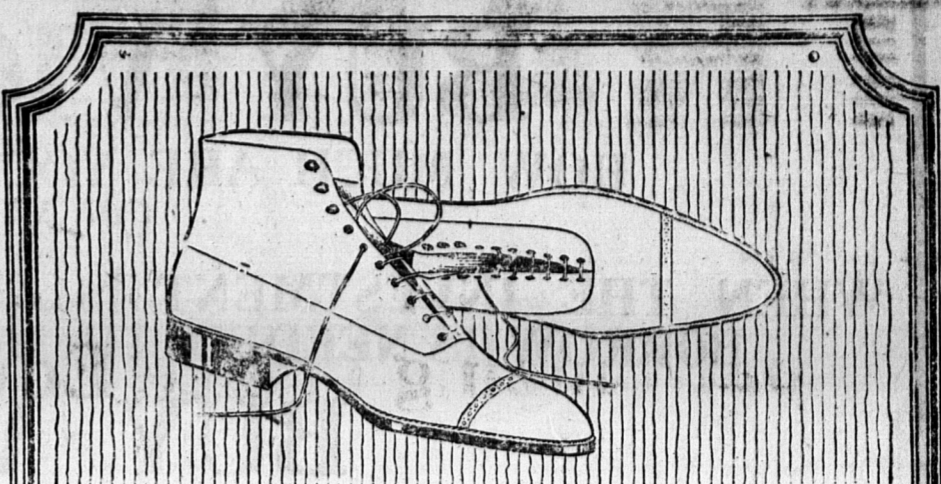
