Barr Destroyed By Fire At Alexandria

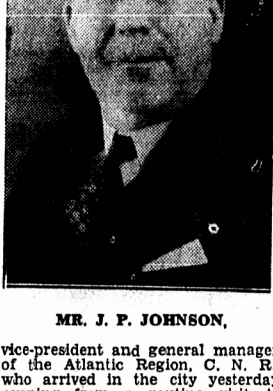
