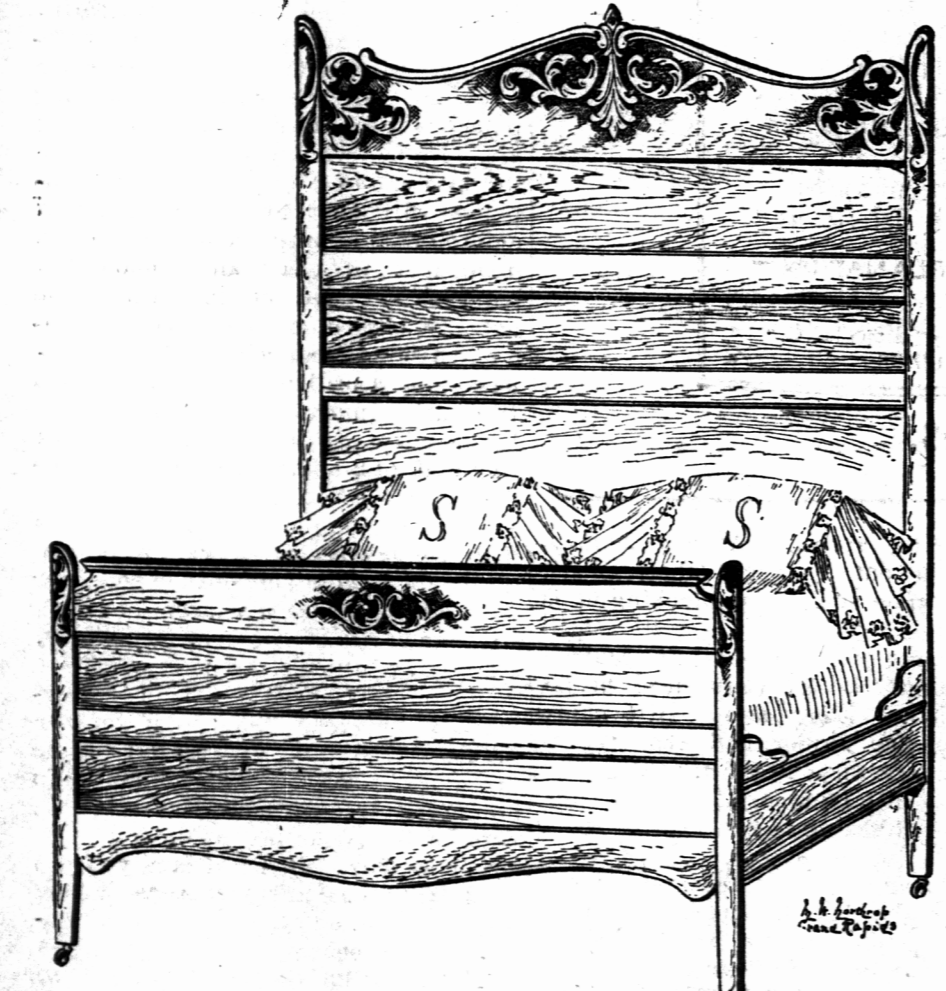

THE TELEGRAPH SERVICE.

In other columns this morning we print the opinions of ten or twelve prominent citizens of Charlottetown in regard to the half-time, double-rate telegraph service to which our Island is subjected. These opinions are representative of both political parties, and leading men in mercantile and professional life. We give the answers of all who have been inquired of so far. They are quite unanimous in the view that our present telegraph service is an imposition to which a fire progressive people ought not longer to submit.

We are astonished that it has been tolerated so long. The Government of Canada, which pays the Anglo-America monopoly nearly two thousand dollars a year, might long ago have secured for us a day and night service at reasonable rates. We were led to believe that they would do so, and we remained silent for a time. We have waited patiently and in vain for any improvement. It is now surely time for the people of the Island to assert themselves.

Britain is at war and our own sons and brothers will be soon fighting at the front in South Africa. It is emphatically a time when every portion of the Empire should have facilities for instant communication by day and night with each other and with the central government. It is intolerable that we should be at such a time cut off during twelve hours of the twenty-four from telegraphic connection with the outside world.

Toronto consumers get their gas for 90 cents per thousand and the gas company, after paying a 10 per cent dividend put by \$81,364 as the profits of the year's business. The World claims that the people of Toronto should have had 80 cent gas last year, and should now get it for 70 cents a thousand. No doubt a large city can be supplied with gas at a lower rate than a small one, but there is an unaccountable margin between the highest and lowest prices paid for gas in Canadian cities and towns.

At length the Drummond County Railway has been paid for by the

Government and become the property of Canada. The purchase price was \$1,400,000 but the cheque was \$1,439,000, the balance being made up of moneys before paid as lease money, and \$25,000 still retained until some minor matters are adjusted. The parties receiving the money, which was paid on Tuesday last, were Messrs. J. N. Greenshields, William Mitchell and William Farwell.

The Normadie, with the Nineteenth Hussars and remounts.
The Oriental, with the First Royal Welsh Fusiliers and Sixth brigade staff, 1,135 men.
The Armeonian, with artillery, 580 men.
The Jamaican, with B. Squadron, Fourteenth Hussars, and No. 9 company, Royal Army Medical Corps, 160 men.
