Sir,—I notice an editorial in your issue of the 23rd June concerning the appointment of an Assyrian—or rather a Syrian—to the position of News Agent on the P. E. I. Railway. The appointment of news agents rests with Mr. Grey, not with the Superintendent, nor yet with "a defeated candidate."

Let me tell you that all the Syrians in the Province are British subjects—loyal subjects of the King—therefore Canadian citizens. They are law-abiding, respectable, industrious and consequently claim the same rights and privileges as citizens of any other nationality in this broad Dominion. Not only do we claim those rights and privileges but we are entitled to them. With regard to your "preference" for born Islanders, I would say if they are otherwise superior to outsiders let them have the position, otherwise there should be no preference. This country is cosmopolitan. If your doctrine were followed out in the United States, how many "Successful P. E. Islanders abroad" could you refer to?

With reference to Asiatics probably if you yourself, Mr. Editor would search up the annals of your ancestry, you yourself are one. The Syrians need not be ashamed to be called Asiatic as our Saviour was an Asiatic.
