AN ULTIMATUM TO THE PORTE

LONDON, Nov. 15.—(Special)—The Ambassadors of the powers at Constantinople today presented to the Porte an ultimatum demanding financial control of Macedonia and a two-year extension of the term of office of the European gendarmes and Austrian and Russian civil agents.

LONDON, Nov. 13.—The coming winter is rapidly showing the inadequacy of the makeshift bill for providing employment in relief of the prevailing distress.

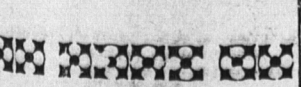
