

# Beavers Lengthen Big Four League Lead By Whipping Hawks 4-0

SAINT JOHN, N. B., Jan. 17.—(CP)—Saint John Beavers lengthened their leadership of the Maritime Senior Hockey League by whitewashing the slipping Moncton Hawks 4-0 tonight in the third shutout since the league schedule opened last October.

Hawks, who lost to Dartmouth Arrows by the same score Dec. 1, remained in a second place tie with Arrows, three points below Saint John.

Beavers ended with a brace after shooting one in the first and another in the second. They carried most of the offensive in the close-checking contest.

Dick Wray shot a pair and regained the loop's scoring leadership. Ralph Croucher and Mike Demchuk netted the other tallies.

Dud James, who helped Hawk teams to Allan Cup championships in the 1930's, was on hand for his first game as coach with the current squad of Hawks. His predecessor, Les Ramsay, stepped out after a slump lost Moncton its league leadership.

## Cleveland Indians Plan Busy Spring

CHICAGO, Jan. 17.—(AP)—The world champion Cleveland Indians will be the busiest baseball club—and most persistent National League rival—in the American League's 241-game spring exhibition season.

The "grapefruit" circuit program, including 132 games with National League clubs, was announced today by American League headquarters.

It begins March 13, twelve days after spring toil starts in the Florida, California and Arizona training bases.

The Indians' champion Tribe plays more spring games (than any other major circuit club, 37) and has the most dates with National League contenders, 24. Sixteen, however, are with New York Giants, also operating in Arizona.

The American League also has 28 intra-league contests and 77 tests against top minor league teams. Philadelphia Athletics make the only foreign junket, playing three games at Havana.

The White Sox and St. Louis Browns each have 36 spring games booked, followed by New York Yankees and Athletics with 34 apiece. Detroit Tigers with 32, and Boston Red Sox and Washington Senators, 30 each.

Along with their 16-game showdown with the Giants which winds up at the Polo Grounds in New York, April 17, the Indians also tangle with Chicago Cubs and Pittsburgh Pirates of the National League, the White Sox and Browns from their own league, and have six jousts with minor league teams.

## STURDY ANT HILLS
