FIRE CHIEF CHARGED WITH INCENDIARISM

ST. JOHN, N. B., July 7.—A striking development in connection with the wave of incendiarism, which has been keeping the city awake at nights for the past several months occurred this morning when John McAndrews, district chief of the West St. John section of the fire department, was arrested, charged with setting fire to the woodshed in the rear of Mrs. Letitia Leslie's residence in the west end. Mrs. Leslie heard a noise outside the house about midnight on Saturday, and looking out saw the firebug at work. He fled when she screamed, and she managed to extinguish the fire with a few pails of water.

The police were notified and this morning McAndrews was arrested and identified by Mrs. Leslie. He was taken before the court, pleaded no guilt, and was remanded until to-morrow.

McAndrews has been connected with the fire service for many years, and has always borne an excellent reputation both as a citizen and as an official. His arrest came as a great surprise and could scarcely be credited by his many friends.

McAndrews denies all knowledge of the matter, but Mrs. Leslie is prepared to swear that he is the man she saw setting the fire.

So far no connection between McAndrews and the many other incendiary fires which have occurred recently has been established.

QUEEN MARY WATCHED LITTLE WHITE MICE.

LONDON, July 7.—A select little family of white rats and mice, four in number, monopolized the attention of Queen Mary for several minutes on the afternoon. Her Majesty opened the new buildings of Bedford College at Regents' Park.

The rodents were confined in cages in the laboratory for experimental psychology.

When the Queen entered the laboratory the mice were running about cages. At her Majesty's request they were taken from their cells to exhibit their accomplishments. Some mazes which lay on a bench adjoining were covered with glass and Her Majesty watched with interest the progress of the two mice. They have to run through the mazes to an opening, where food is placed for them, but one, reluctant to start upon the journey, covered at the sound made by a member of the royal entourage.

"He's frightened," remarked the Queen, and tapped the glass covering as an intimation to the mouse that she would like him to complete the experiment. Thereupon he scuttled through the maze, Her Majesty laughing at his spasmodic efforts.

Lord Rosebery, wearing the gold embroidered robes of Chancellor of the University of London, delivered the inaugural speech. Referring to the encouragement the Queen's presence was to the work of the college, he said they had a claim upon Her Majesty as titular and cherished head of womanhood of England.

Her Majesty was one of the two honorary graduates of the University of London. "The other," he added, with a smile, "is His Majesty the King."

Lord Haldane, in expressing his thanks to the Queen, said Her Majesty had set an example to those who were enthusiastic for education.

"It is only in my lifetime," remarked Lord Rosebery, "that the nation has awakened to the importance of education for women."
