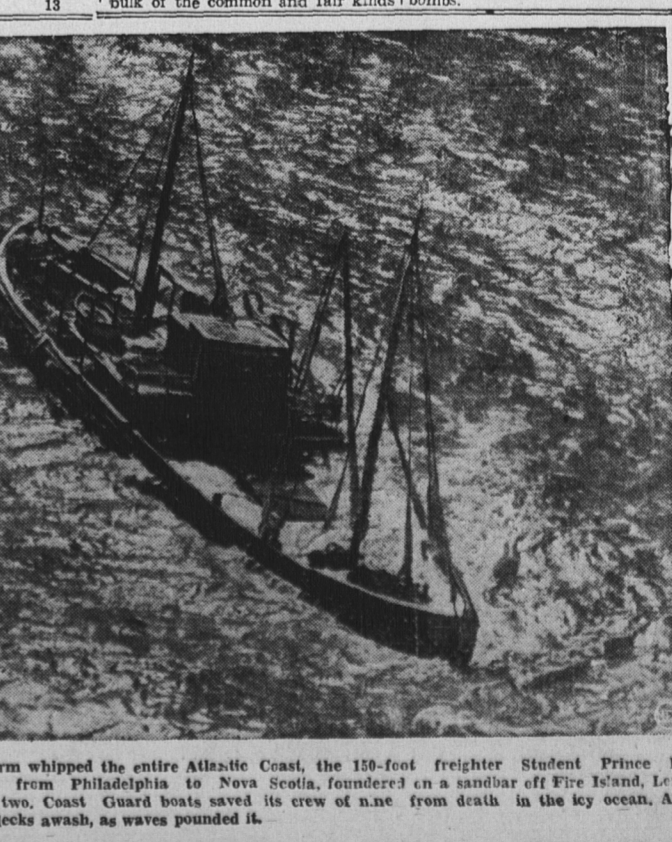

in mixed lots sold between \$6.25 and \$6.75 with a few of the commoner kinds between \$5 and \$6. The bulk of the pigs were \$11.50 for B-1 dressed with odd sales up to \$11.60. B-1 alive fed and watered were \$6.50, and B-1 alive off trucks delivered \$8.75. Grade "A" drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$5.50 to \$6.75.

Livestock

MONTREAL, March 25-(CP)—There were 99 cattle, 8 sheep and lambs, 830 hogs, and 1,704 calves for sale today on the two Montreal livestock markets. Cattle were practically all of common quality and were sold at yesterday's levels. Canners and cutters ranged from \$3.50 to \$4.50, and common and medium cows from \$4.75 to \$6. Common bulls were \$5 to \$6.25. Calves were estimated to be close to \$3 lower than a week ago Monday. A few top calves sold at \$8.50 with medium calves around \$7.25, on the bulk of the common and fair kinds
