Quebec, Oct. 24—(CP)—A husband has the right to get his wife by the arm and bring her home if she talks too much with a neighbor, Judge Aohille Pettigrew decided today in rejecting a complaint of assault against the husband.

According to Crown evidence, the husband did not like this neighboring companionship of his wife and another woman and, one day last week, while the two were chatting, he grabbed his wife by the arm and took her home.

"I must admit that there is discord in this household, but I am sure that the husband had the right to go and get his wife, even by the arm, if he wants her home," the Judge said.

Churches Ask Study Of Living Costs In Canada

HAMILTON, Oct. 23—(CP)—The Canadian Council of Churches, whose fourth annual convention continued here today, adopted a resolution asking Prime Minister Mackenzie King to form a parliamentary committee to study the cost of living.

It further requested a session of Parliament "at the earliest possible date to deal with this matter."

The Council urged the Dominion Government to institute a national low-rental housing program to provide adequate housing for low-income families at rentals they could afford.

Dr. J.R. Mutohmor of Toronto, secretary of the United Church Department of Evangelism and Social Service, said the small-income family was particularly hard-hit by rising prices.

Will Take 1,000 Tons Of Meats For Britain

MONTREAL, Oct. 23—(CP)—When the cargo liner Beavercove leaves for London this week she will carry more than 1,000 tons of bacon and frozen meats, her officers said today. Originally the only 500 tons, gathered from independent packers, but with the end of the packinghouse workers' strike her meat cargo has been doubled.

The American market is replacing the British market as an outlet for Canadian poultry and prices being received for Canadian poultry on this market is equal to prices paid last year under British contract. HEALTHFUL EXPEDIENTS TO BRING RESTFUL SLEEP

A bed should be un-made for restful sleeping, if it has been made up with tightly-tucked covers. Feet closely confined in an envelope of covers will try to escape, thus breaking into your sleep.

Covers rearranged for the serious business of sleeping should be loosened all around the bed and pulled free of the mattress at one side. The lower sheet, however, should be tucked tight again until it is as smooth as glass.

You'll sleep better, incidentally, if your blankets are a family of lightweight that are easy to peel off or pile on than if they are fewer in number and heavier in weight. The more air that's allowed to circulate in your room, the more refreshed you will feel when you awake. So plan to open the windows and pile on the blankets. If you have trouble popping off, try some form of heat therapy to cozen relaxation before you go to bed. There are various home types available to you.

One is a warm, sleep-lulling bath. This is one of the best and most dependable tension-chasers. But bath water must be neither too hot nor too cold about body temperature is the best. Such a bath can be made more soporific if you'll toss into your tub a few tablespoons of mustard powder.

A few minutes' exposure under an ultra-violet lamp is a sleep-inducer par excellence for some people. If there are constricted nerves at the back of the neck or other areas, the application of a heating pad helps to relieve tensions and

Also under the heading of heat therapy comes the warm nightcap of hot herbal tea, strained vegetable soup, clear meat broth or milk. If you want to make a hot cup of milk more of a bedtime treat, add malt, postum or a tablespoonful of cognac.
