### AGRICULTURE.

MR. J. B. SPENCE, AL GRANT, Mr. J. B. Spence, Al Grant, visited the St. John Exhibition during the week in connection with the expenditure of the Dominion Government for Agriculture. He is very well pleased with the live stock judging classes being carried on by the Department and particularly pleased with the agricultural picnics. These bring together the young and the old people of the community in the way that live stock judging classes alone do not, and they encourage the community spirit which is so important in country districts. He expected to have been present at the agricultural picnic to be held on the farm of Wm. Clark North Whitehead but received word that it would be necessary for him to go back to Ottawa immediately. The picnic will not be held till Saturday, July 18th. Everyone interested is invited to be present, especially if they bring a basket.

### SAINT JOHN EXHIBITION.

The dates of the St. John Exhibition are from September 5th to 12th, and from reports received from Exhibition headquarters. This year's fair promises to be especially interesting. All available space was spoken for and booked remarkably early and several applicants are now on the waiting list in the hope that readjustments can be made, which will permit of giving them space. The demand has been so great, that not one foot in the main buildings has been sold for the use of anything which is not a bone fide exhibit with the sole exception of food concessions. It is the intention this year to concentrate all the amusements in the midway and before the grandstand and to have these on an even better scale than heretofore, the main buildings being reserved so as to be truly representative of the manufacturers, farmers and business houses of the Maritime Provinces. From present forecasts the exhibition will this year reflect in a comprehensive manner the optimism and progressiveness that has taken such strong hold during the last few years of the people in these Provinces. Saint John has a reputation to sustain with regard to its exhibition and seems determined that the one to be held this year will maintain this reputation.

### THE CHEESE BOARD.

The Cheese Board held its regular meeting Friday with only a fair attendance of sellers and buyers present. The buyers in attendance were Messrs. Spillet, Bittin, and Nowell. Mr. Walter Simpson occupied the chair. The cable message read: "Five thousand five hundred cheese offered on the Brockville Board, 260 sold at 12 1/2; curb price the same. Cool cured one sixteenth higher." The following cables offered cheese:—Stanley, 204; New Glasgow, 250; Kensington, 300; Gowan Bra, 40; Cornwall, 80. Mr. Nowell offered 12 1/2 for selection of the board which the salesman refused. Mr. Spillet made a call at 12 five sixteenths which was also refused, the salesman holding for 12 1/2. Mr. Geo. Brown of New Glasgow offered the following resolution seconded by Mr. Profit of Kensington:—"That this cheese board greatly regrets the continued small attendance at its meetings and, considering the value the board has been, and is, to the dairy industry, especially in the information given to the salesman by its cable messages received every two weeks, it is felt by this board that to discontinue its meetings would be a distinct loss to all concerned. Therefore, resolved that this cheese board requests all factories to send a representative to the regular fortnightly meetings, or write the secretary, explaining their attitude as to the support of future meetings of the Board, either by sending a representative or pledging their financial support." The board meets on the following dates July 24th, Aug. 7th, and 21st, Sept. 4th, and 18th, Oct. 2nd, and 16th, and 30th.

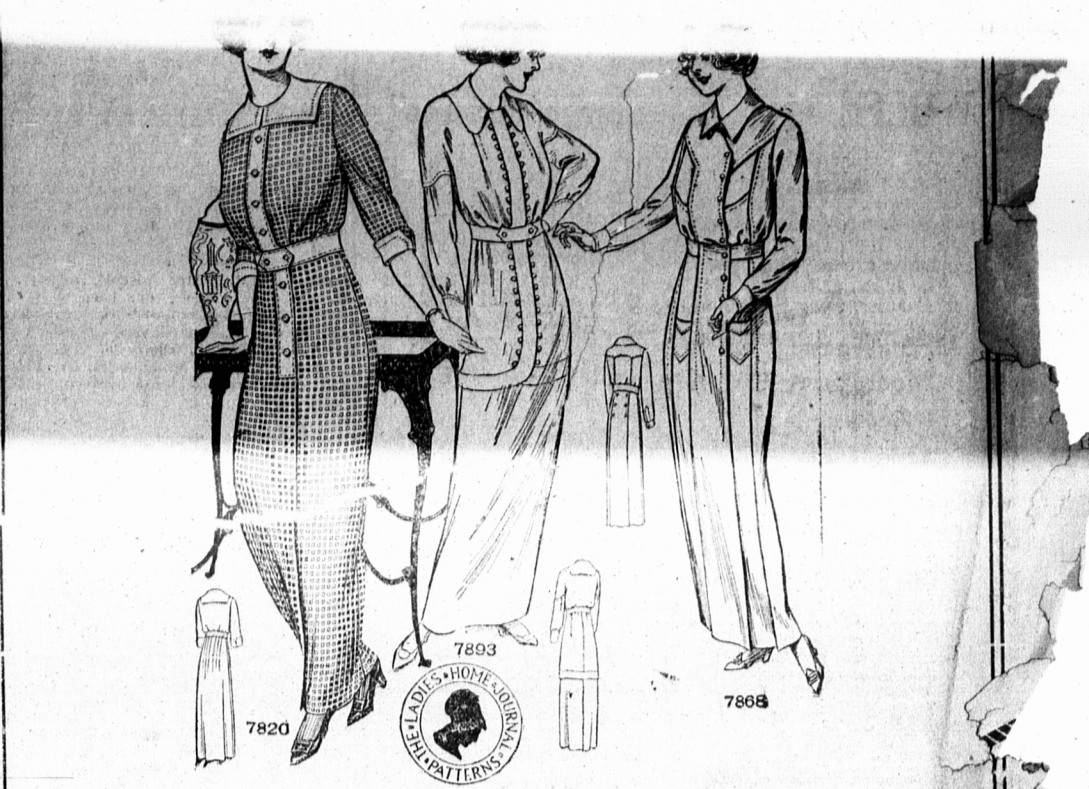
