Stocks Drift Lower After Early Rally

NEW YORK, March 7 (AP)—The stock market worked up a mild rally in the morning but cooled off considerably before the close. At the best gains ran to a point or so for favored steels, motors, rubbers, aircraft, rails and specialties. Final prices in the majority of cases were well under the day's tops. Small minus signs also were plentiful. Dealings were sluggish both on rising and reactionary intervals, with transfers totalling 568,830 shares against 842,540 the day before. The Associated Press average, however, managed to retain a net advance of .2 of a point at 52.3. Brazilian was the principal gainer in the Canadian department, moving up 1 1-8 point to 10 1-8. Foreign exchange rates were international Nickel, McIntyre, Canadian Car, Ford and Shawinigan while slight losses were shown in Distillers, Seagram, Dome and Lake Shore. Aircraft revived on the thought the proposal to limit profits on war planes to 10 per cent of the contract price may have been as unfavorable as at first surmised. The senate passed an amendment for this limitation in the afternoon. Steels came back when it was forecast by some observers this week's dip in mill operations might be only temporary. Most rails were slightly ahead notwithstanding word from Washington that legislation for the carriers at this session was unlikely.

Currencies

NEW YORK, March 7 (AP)—A rally in the Netherlands guilder, which advanced .07 cent to 53.15, led most other major European currencies to higher rates in terms of the dollar today. Foreign exchange quarters attributed the advance more to general feeling that European political tangles showed signs of straightening out than to any specific news development. Sterling gained 1-8 cent to \$4.69 15-16 and the French franc 1-8 cent to 2.25 3-16 while the Belgian and Swiss franc were narrowly up. Canadian funds closed at a discount of 5-16 per cent, an advance of 1-32 cent.
