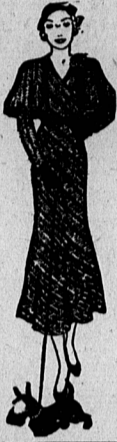

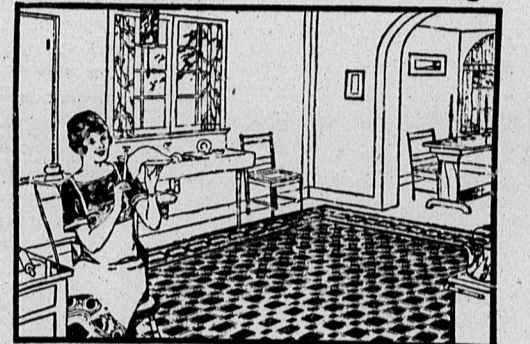

#### GIRLS RUN FACTORY

DUBLIN, October 17—The cheerful clack of machinery bids defiance to depression in a Dublin factory which is run by 170 working girls.

Situated in a humble street, the factory exists only for the manufacture of rosary beads, and the proprietor is a great-nephew of the famous Irish patriot and author,

John Mitchel.

The business is unique in Ireland. The girls who work in the factory elect a council every year and they decide wages, hours, and working conditions. They know the profits and expenses and they see the books. Each girl has as much of a vote as the proprietor.

The hooves of nearly all cattle slaughtered in Ireland come to the little mill in Waterford street. High speed machinery turns them into the horn beads that have a sale the world over. Profits are substantial, working conditions satisfactory. The girls say they are happy.
