IN THE CONSERVATIVE CAMP.

It was pretty generally expected that Mr. Borden would be endorsed for leader of his party by the Montreal Conservative convention as was done. But there were some who before held that this ought not to be done. Mr. Borden's position was indeed a singular one. It was not so very remarkable that a leader should have been defeated in the constituency of his choice. That had happened to other and greater leaders before. But it was remarkable that Mr. Borden was defeated himself and was also left without a single supporter among the representatives of his Province. It was this fact that taxed the fidelity of his followers and made the choice of another leader seem possible, if indeed there had been another available man.

But there was no other in sight at once so well fitted for the place and so free from objection as Mr. Borden. Opposition was indeed stirring against him in Toronto, and might have made some headway had there been another man in sight who seemed to possess the requisites for leadership, the commanding talents, and magnetic personality whose union is so rare. The Toronto Telegram a few days ago gave expression to the chief objections against continuing Mr. Borden in the leadership. It said:

"The best service that Mr. R. L. Borden can render the Conservative party is to stay in retirement until his own province calls him back to public life, or until it is made clear and manifest that the Opposition must fall back on Mr. Borden in default of a better leader.

"What the Conservative party needs at present is not flatterers, but friends. Mr. Borden is a nice man, who could not carry his own province, and had no more to do with sweeping Ontario for the Conservatives than he had to do with sweeping the United States for Roosevelt. The Conservatives should remember that it is easier to find a leader whom the party does want than to get rid of a leader whom the party does not want. Mr. Borden is the unanimous choice of his political enemies for the leadership of the Conservative party. A strong leader is never popular with his political enemies. The advisers who are trying to force Mr. Borden back into a position to which he was never called by the rank and file of the party are Mr. Borden's flatterers rather than friends to the Conservative cause."

It was further objected in certain quarters that Mr. Borden was too much the choice of what has been called the Tupper-Montreal Star wing of the party; that he has not been sufficiently aggressive and that he was not fortunate in the formulation of his transcontinental railway policy. Against all these objections Mr. Borden has scored a signal triumph in the unanimous endorsement of the

**HALIFAX MARKETS.**

Saturday.  
The produce market is firmer this week and eggs continue to soar. They have advanced in some instances as much as two cents and are now selling here at 23 and 24 cents per dozen. The supply in Prince Edward Island is pretty well exhausted and Charlottetown now quotes 22 cents F. O. B., with the prospect of higher prices any time. Demand is active and dealers here are laying in all they can get at present prices.  
Butter is about the same and choicedairy and creamery are both scarce. The latter is selling at the factories at 23 cents. Choicedairy is worth 19 cents.  
Cheese is unchanged and the market in the Upper Provinces is firm under light stocks. One firm here is selling as low as 9 cents, but this is below the market, 10 to 11 is a fair quotation.  
The market is still well stocked with potatoes at 30 cents, chiefly from P. E. I. Carrots and parsnips are in good demand and none too plentiful at \$1.75. Apples remain steady with abundant supplies of fair grade fruit. There is a little firmer this week owing to better weather, small hogs being quoted at 65 cents.
