GERMANS READY FOR INVASION

METZ, May 1—The two German army corps which are stationed in Alsace-Lorraine, the Fifteenth and Seventeenth, have been completely equipped with the new weapons before the rest of the German Army.

When it was stated that England had promised France to assist her in case of an outbreak of war by landing 100,000 British troops in Schleswig-Holstein, the German press ridiculed the idea, the German Authorities however seem to have taken the matter more seriously. The government has asked and obtained from the Reichstag the sum of \$1,625,000 for the immediate construction of strategic railways which are necessary for the defense of the empire.

Seven lines in Schleswig-Holstein are to be provided with the double sets of metals. This will render possible the quick concentration of troops in case of the landing of a hostile army at any point south of Kiel. There is no commercial need whatever for the extension of the railways.
