THE St. John Star of Jan. 12th: Rev. L. G. Macneil has been confined to his house for several days with grippe. Evangelist H. A. McLean is expected in town to-day, and will assist Rev. Ira Smith in a series of evangelistic services in Leinster street church, commencing to-morrow.

John Hamilton Lane, lately registrar of probate for the country of Pictou, died very suddenly at the home of his son-in-law, G. E. Johnstone, of Pictou, one of Pictou's oldest and most respected citizens and was in his 83rd year. In his younger days Mr. Lane was connected with the imperial customs at St. John and Pictou, and was superannuated about the time of confederation. He was subsequently appointed registrar of probate for Pictou county which office he resigned about a year ago owing to failing health. Mr. Lane's wife was a daughter of the late William Mortimore, one of the best known men of Pictou in the old days, and was a sister of the wife of Chief Justice McDonald. H. B. S. Lane, of the justice department, Ottawa; C. W. Lane, barrister, of Lunenburg, and M. T. Lane, of Sackville, and the surviving sons of the deceased. Three daughters also survive him namely, Mary, at present residing with her brother in Lunenburg, Jane, wife of G. E. Johnstone of the customs at Pictou, and Amelia, wife of T. R. Ferguson, chief engineer of the government steamer Aberdeen. Mr. Lane belonged to a very old English family, and was a son of the late Major Ambrose Lane, town major of Charlottetown, P. E. I., and who was also acting governor of that province for some years. His mother was a daughter of the late Governor Douglas Smith, of Prince Edward Island, and a niece of the late Admiral Sir Sydney Smith. Major Sydney Smith, Harvest, who was in Halifax this week en route to Victoria, B. C. is a nephew of Mr. Lane, and on the arrival of the Carthaginian on Monday last Major Harvest went to Pictou to see his uncle and on the way there heard of his death. Major Harvest proceeded west yesterday after attending the funeral.—Halifax Herald.

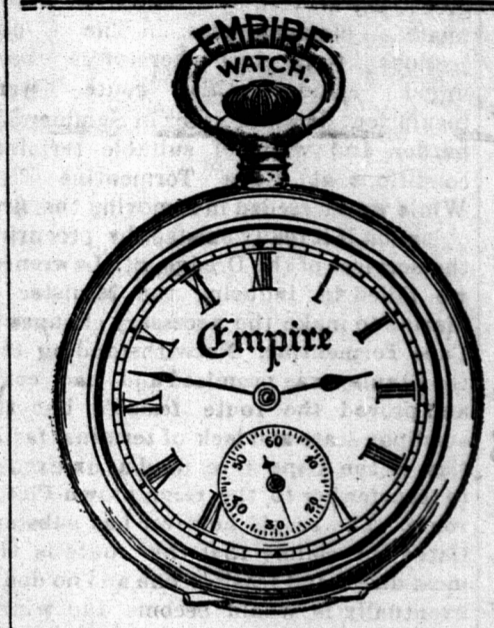
