The Reporter's Status.

It has been said that the social status of a reporter in London is one grade higher than that enjoyed by the domestic—in other words, he is one. This does not prevent his literary status for being good, however, and well sustained. In America there are just the opposite, says the New York Times. Here a reporter may go almost anywhere and usually has the advantage of being well received; his literary ability is unfortunately very often of the same grade as the social status of his London colleague. It appears, however, that in Vienna the position of the reporter in all phases is not thought highly of, and a society has been formed under the name of Verband der Wiener Zeitungskorrespondenten, whose highly worthy object is to watch over the interests of reporters and to raise their literary and social status. In the light of the Anglo-American entente cordiale a similar society might be formed between London and New York; the social improvement might be the work of the London department, while the New York end could attend to the literary part; it would bring the journalists of the two countries nearer together and make it possible for them to meet on a more equal footing all around.
