**Selected Industrials Weak At Montreal**  
 MONTREAL, Dec. 15 (CP)—Selected industrial issues displayed fractional weakness in quiet dealings on the stock exchange today. Mining shares skidded for losses ranging from one cent to 15 cents on an active market.  
 Closing averages indicated banks off 0.30; utilities off 0.3 at 7:48; industrials off 0.2 to 12.3; papers off 2.39 at 3:59.4; golds off 2.45 at 7:48. Approximate industrial sales were 34,600 shares, an increase of 2,500 shares over Friday's sales. Mining sales expanded to 191,300 shares.  
 In papers, Donnacona, on a turnover of 1,075 shares lost one point at 22 1/2. B. C. Pulp dropped 3 points at 94. Powell River slipped 1-2 at 40. Brown and Price were off 1-4 each. Their respective closing quotations were 6 1/8 and 68. B. C. Forest was shaded at 3 1/2. In metals, Imperial Oil gained 1 1/2 at 96.14. International Paper gained 1-2 at 60 on a turnover of 1,020 shares.  
 Gaseps gained 1-2 at 167 1/2 in utilities while C.P.R. on a turnover of 1,575 shares added 1-2 at 13 7/8 in carriers. In beverages, Seagrams went ahead 1-4 at 23 1/2. Walker was off 1-8 at 28 3/8. In 1-2 and Imperial Oil on a turnover of 1,267 shares gained 1-4 at 14 7/8.  
 In mines, East Sullivan dropped 15 cents at 300 and Eldona, on a turnover of 3,200 shares lost 11 cents. Sullivan slipped 10 cents at 1.90. Beaulieu hit a new low of 23, losing 8 cents, on a turnover of 21,600 shares.

**Gold Stocks Drop Sharply At Toronto**  
 TORONTO, Dec. 15 (CP)—Golds dropped sharply on the Toronto Stock Exchange today in moderately active trading with losses exceeding Friday's slump. Opening found the list uncertain and only mildly off but increased turnover accelerated the downward movement and the majority of issues closed at their new lows for the day.  
 Base metals followed the gold trend and western oils cut earlier gains to close on over-all losses. The exchange's closing index showed golds down 4.14 at 103.52, lowest index point since May 22—base metals 1.28 at 84.90, western oils 55 at 28.88.  
 McIntyre led senior golds downward on a loss of \$4 at \$57.50 while fractions were lost by Dome, Kerr, Addison, Lake Shore and others in the list dropped up to 40 cents. Among the juniors a score or more lost from ten to 25 cents with heavier losers Caribou, Coch-nour, Comiarum, Conwest, Del-nite, Delta, Dickenson, Giani, God's Lake, Kirkland Lake, Macassa, MacLeod, Madsen, O'Brian, Osulake, Pamour, Pickle Crow, Powell, Preston, San Antonio, Sullivan, Sylvania, Upper Canada.  
 A weak base metals list closed on a fractional gain for Nickel with losses for about 18 issues ranging up to \$1 for Noranda.  
 Sparked by news of price in increases in crude oil and talk of boosts in gasoline prices, the western oils moved up on a broad front in good action during the early session and maintained the lead until the final hour of trading. Towards the close, however, prices eased and the list about balanced gains and losses with key issues off. Down were Anglo-Canadian, British Dominion, Calgary and Edmonton, Foothills Home Oil, Okala.  
 Western oils listed 7 gains, 5 losses, 5 unchanged; mining issues 22 gains, 159 losses, 57 unchanged.

**Livestock**  
 MONTREAL, Dec. 15 (CP)—Tradings in general were slow on the two Montreal livestock markets today. Prices were steady. Receipts: 1,755 cattle; 1,152 calves; 1,082 hogs; 1,089 sheep.  
 Cattle trading was slow with prices estimated about steady with last week.  
 There were no choice steers offered; medium quality steers sold between 12-13.50 and common light steers were 10 up. The few heifers sold were common to high quality and sold between 9-12. Good butcher cows brought 10-11 with medium kinds between 9-10 and common butchers 7.25-8.75. Canners and cutters were from 6-7, selling mostly offered and these were practically all of common quality and prices ranged from 7-9.50 according to quality.  
 Calves were steady to strong. Good quality veals were mostly 17 with a few selling as high as 18. Common to medium quality veals ranged from 12-16.50 and grassers were 8-11.  
 Early trading on hogs was slow to start. Buyers were bidding 33 for Grade A and sellers were holding for more money.  
 Good ewes and wethers were steady at 16-16.50 with buck lambs discounted 1.00 and culls 9-12. Sheep ranged from 4-9 according to weight and quality.
