000 in 1921 to \$4,000,000 in 1923-24. And of this \$4,000,000 the greater part was paid by those engaged in the pulp and paper and mining industries. Business is by this showing greatly depressed and it is at a time like this that the reduction of the tariff has come with such unsettling and depressing effect.

The so-called Progressives in Parliament, dominate the King government. Their ultimate aim is free trade. They do not disguise the fact; rather they proclaim it and accept the Robb tariff in only "a step in the right direction," a partial fulfillment of their demands, to be more completely fulfilled next year and in the years
