Mr. Gallant realizes that the black and whites are the coming breed of cattle for the Province, but, at the same time, he is aware that the improvement of a herd is mainly due to the sire placed at its head. Having this object in view and wishing to encourage the progressive dairymen of Rustico, he has secured a son of Palatin Ormsby, bred by W.A. Matheson, Utica, New York. Palatin Ormsby has a sister with a record of 29.4 pounds of butter in seven days and 129.59 in 30 days. His dam has a record of 22.35 and his grand-dam 24.2 pounds in 7 days. This young representative of the Ormsby family can boast of his ancestors not only on his sire's side, but his own dam, Hon. J. P. Inke Paul, has to her credit a record of 29.81 pounds of butter in 7 days and is very closely related to Bontje & Pieterie de Kol 29.78 pounds of milk in one year at the Ontario Agricultural College. Her grand-dam, Howie's, imported from Holland, produced 83.3 pounds of milk in one day and 257.7 pounds of milk in 20 days. Mr. Gallant is to be congratulated on his acquisition and he and his neighbors in the near future, will likely have abundant success in dairying, for the descendants of this young sire, which combines the blood of so many high producing females, can not but give a good account of themselves at the milk pail.

Synopsis of Sections of Act referred to.

Public Notice

Section 2, provides that Births must be registered within thirty days from the date of such Birth by parents &c. Section 16, provides that no minister or other person in Charlotteville, Summerside and Georgetown shall bury or perform any funeral service unless he has received a certificate under the hand of the Registrar stating that the particulars of the Death has been registered, and no undertaker or other person in said towns shall bury or assist in burying any body except under the same conditions imposed upon ministers or other persons.

Section 17, provides that the medical practitioner last in attendance during the illness of any person shall send a certificate, under his signature, of the cause of death, within forty-eight hours of the death, to the Registrar, Blank for which purpose may be obtained from the Registrar. Section 35, provides that any Householder, Head of Family, Clergyman, Physician or other person or persons required by this Act to report Births, Deaths, and Marriages, who refuses or willfully neglects to do so within the time named, shall upon conviction for each and every offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty (20) Dollars and costs.
