MACINNES, N. Y. GETS THRILL OF CITY SAVINGS

Blows A Pibroch After All The Irish Have Gone Home. To Retire in 1938.

Despite daily rides in the Municipal Building elevators, Mr. MacInnes remains a tough, good humored and well preserved Scot, who relaxes by stomping up and down the vacant corridors and blowing a pibroch after the Irish have gone home.

Reviewing his thirty-nine years as an accountant, Mr. MacInnes said yesterday that the "most dramatic" episode of his career had been the steady reduction of net interest costs on city bonds from around 4 per cent to a new low of 1.7699 per cent.

"Man, it's dramatic," he said. "Why under the bankers' agreement of October 30, 1933, the bankers could have exacted 4 per cent interest. Comptroller Taylor, in negotiations since 1935, has obtained concessions whereby instead of paying 4 per cent we now get money at 1.25 per cent."
