Stock Market Prices Show Slight Decline

NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—(AP)—For the second time this month the stock market couldn't make the grade. Today, though, declines were small and a substantial number of issues crept a little higher. Volume slackened as prices backed down, which Wall Street considers a favorable sign in a declining market.

More than the usual caution or timidity seemed to hang over the financial district.

Turnover dropped to 630,000 shares from 800,000 Thursday which was a high for the month. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 3 of one point to 68.3, or a shade under the best level in a month or so. The rail component showed the widest decline, off 5 of one point.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, Oct. 8.—(CP)—Fractional losses narrowly edged out gains among selected industrials during quiet trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market here today. Mines were also slightly easier in continued dull dealings.

Canadian Vickers Ptd. dropped to 131 1/2, a loss of 67 points, after the stock went ex-dividend \$7.75 today. The common posted a gain of three points. The issues here followed a similar move on the Toronto market yesterday.

Closing averages indicated banks off .05 at 26.37; utilities up 3 at 74.1; industrials up 2 at 130.6; papers off 1.94 at 350.51 and golds up 48 at 60.16.

Industrial sales were approximately 35,500 shares, or 2,500 shares fewer than yesterday's total. Mining turnover was 70,500 shares, compared with 106,000 shares in the preceding session.

At Toronto

TORONTO, Oct. 8.—(CP)—Prices were irregularly mixed as trading slowed down on the Toronto Stock Exchange today. Base metals lost part of yesterday's strong advance. Golds held steady on mixed gains and losses and western oils showed a slightly firmer tone.

The big-gainers of yesterday's base metals list, when the exchange index rose to the highest figure since February, 1946, dipped down as slight profit-taking was evident. Noranda, Quemont, and International Nickel dipped fractionally while Waite Amulet, Gulf Lead and Pend Oreille were down 5 cents.

Senior golds were ahead while losses outnumbered gains in juniors.

At London

LONDON, Oct. 8.—(Reuters)—Chief item of interest in the stock exchange today was the start of dealing in the new £15,000,000 Australian three-per-cent loan of 1946-67.

The opening price was 3-4 point premium but good buying quickly lifted this to 1-3-8 premium. Gift-edged stocks were again firm and generally recorded improvements of 1-16.

There was revival of interest in oil shares.

Winnipeg Grain

WINNIPEG, Oct. 8.—(CP)—The United Kingdom was allocated 500,000 bushels of wheat on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today.

In coarse grain futures, more liberal offerings appeared in oats barley, particularly in barley. Prices generally showed an easier tone in both grains.

Rye came in for fairly good buying from exporters, shippers and other interests. Offerings were on the light side.

Trading was fairly active in rye and only moderately active in the other coarse grains.

Prices of class two wheat—for export to countries other than the United Kingdom—remained unchanged.
