HOLLAND PREPARING.

Army authorities are working under high pressure to obtain war materials. One hundred and fifty new guns are wanted to complete the artillery arms. Large orders for shells and for wool to manufacture uniforms have been placed in England and America.

OTTAWA, April 23.—Canada is the real granary of the Empire. Not only the Motherland, but New Zealand, Australia and South Africa have been looking to the Dominion to replenish their depleted grain supplies.

The Trade and Commerce Department has already shipped 406,731 bushels of wheat for New Zealand and within the next few months will purchase a million more bushels for the New Zealand Government.

This week, the last of a shipment for South Africa was shipped to Cape Town.

GERMAN SOCIALISTS STRIVE FOR PEACE
THE HAGUE, April 22, via London.—The Socialists of Germany are making an earnest effort to seek for a basis on which the cessation of the war can be brought about. Dr. Bretschneider, a prominent member of the German Socialist Party, is now in Holland consulting the Dutch Socialist leaders with a view to getting into communication with the British, and through them, with the French Socialists in an endeavor to bring pressure to bear on the various governments.

It is declared that the German Socialists are virtually unanimous in favor of peace and against any annexation of territory. It is said that although the Socialist newspapers in Germany are not permitted under penalty of suspension to publish criticisms of the Government or express scepticism regarding the results of the war, at a meeting where only members of the party were admitted and from which the police were absent, free discussion in favor of peace took place.
