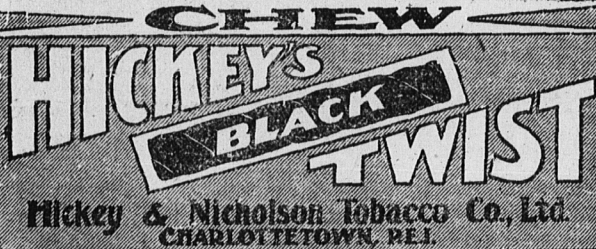

SPECTACULAR FIGHT IN AIR

NEW YORK, Oct. 30.—Immelman, the Falcon, Germany's crack aviator, who had 51 downs to his credit, did not succumb to a fall from the sky, but was shot down during a man-to-man encounter with a youthful British rival that is described by those who witnessed it as the most spectacular even of the entire war.

The letter, which was written by Col. William Macklin of the Canadian army, pictured the duel as a rare spectacle that brought the occupants of trenches on both sides of No Man's Land to their feet, cheering their own fighter and yearning for an opportunity to bet on "the great sporting event of the war."
