The trustee general said the whole matter was a movement not to educate the children but to Anglicize them. Action is deferred.

PRINCE PETER FIRES FIRST GUN.

(Canadian Press) PODGONTZ, Montenegro, Oct. 10—A heavy engagement occurred here yesterday between the Turks and Montenegrins. Prince Peter fired the first gun. This was the signal for a firing all along the line, and an artillery duel ensued within twenty-one minutes. Five Turkish guns were silenced and Turks retreated from their first position on Mount Plamitza. By noon the Turks had evacuated the Mountain. Fighting was still in progress at five o'clock.

ALBERTA GRAIN NOT THERE FOR SHIPMENT.

OTTAWA, October 9—Some hard knocks to the Pacific route for grain shipment were administered by the afternoon's session of the western rate inquiry. Judging from what was said, the inference is that under present conditions the opening of the Panama canal would make an immense difference to western producers of grain, furnishing, as it will, a new water route to Liverpool. The Canadian grain could profitably compete in Mexican market with that of the United States, were it to be had, was another interesting statement made. Owing to inability of Alberta to supply the product no business of this kind has been done since 1909, but conditions this year may be different.

IMPERIAL TRADE COMMISSION.

LONDON, Oct. 10—In the absence of Lord Morley, Hon. Geo. E. Foster is presiding over the sittings of the Imperial Trade Commission. Yesterday's evidence was taken with reference to emigration to New South Wales.

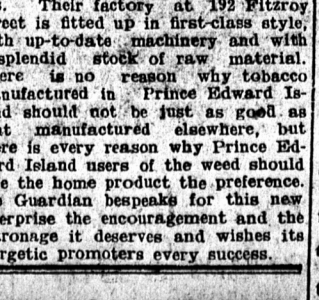
