CHURCH ROBBERY IN ST. JOHN

ST. JOHN, Feb. 16.-Another was added to the list of petty breaks in this City Sunday when, in broad daylight, the Saint Matthews Church on Douglas Avenue was broken into and a sum of money, including all which had been collected at the morning services of the church, was stolen from the building. The robbery was committed between twelve and one o'clock when a number of people were passing along the street on their way home from church.

PAN-BROILED ROUND STEAK

Wipe a piece of beef, cut the bottom of the round, having it weigh about three pounds. Place it on a board, spread with flour, and with the edge of a china plate pound until flour is incorporated. Treat other side in the same manner. Turn again side in the same manner. Sprinkle with salt and put in a hot iron frying pan rubbed over with fat. Fear on each side. Cook fifteen minutes, turning frequently. Remove to hot platter, spread with butter, sprinkle with salt and pepper. Garnish with watercress.
