AUTOMOBILE FINANCING IN AUGUST

The total number of new and used automobiles financed was 4,782 in August, 1933, 5,862 in July, 1933, and 6,080 in August, 1932; and the amount of financing was \$1,808,440 in August, 1933, \$2,137,692 in July, 1933, and \$2,184,701 in August 1932.

NEW VEHICLES FINANCED were 1,386 in August 1933, 1,775 in July 1933, and 1,706 in August, 1932, while used vehicles numbered 3,396 in August 1933, 4,077 in July, 1933, and 4,356 in August 1932.

SUBSCRIPTIONS to The Guardian were \$906,611 in August, 1933, \$1,145,803 in July 1933, and \$1,023,137 in August 1932; and the total for used vehicles was \$91,829 in August, 1933, \$991,889 in July 1933, and \$1,161,564 in August, 1932.
