REV. MORGAN E. GENGE, B.A., Ph.D., D.D.

The Rev. Dr. Genge who passed away on December 22, 1946, was born at Channel, Newfoundland, of noted Devonshire stock.

Giving up sailing, he furthered his educational qualifications which he had begun as a youth by private tuition, under direction of an Oxford Don and eminent classical masters who conducted the extra-mural work of Oxford University in Newfoundland but owing to circumstances he was not able to take his last year in Oxford, England.

Then there followed a period of seafaring life, after which he entered Louisville College and was graduated B.A. Intending to take up medical mission work he matriculated into the medical faculty of that college, but after two years' work decided to enter the ministry of the Christian Church.

Entering the Presbyterian Church in 1925 he supplied and served as minister in several churches. He sat as moderator of the Miramichi Presbytery and for some years was the efficient clerk of Presbytery.

fifteen years at a rate not exceeding 3 per cent. The bill was reported agreed to without amendment.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Barbour the House went into committee with Mr. Kichham in the chair on an Act to amend the Vital Statistics Act.

It provides for the appointment of a Deputy Registrar General. The promoter explained that there is already a young man employed in this capacity now. This would make his appointment official and enable him to sign certificates officially on behalf of the Registrar General.

On motion of Mr. Eugene Callen the House went into committee with Mr. Phillips in the chair on a bill to incorporate the White Spot Raceway Association Ltd.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Campbell the House resumed committee reading of an Act to amend the Town of Montague Incorporation Act.

Innkeepers' Regulations

On motion of Premier Jones the House went into committee with Mr. R. R. Bell in the chair on an Act to regulate and license Inns and restaurants.

The bill provides for the following license fees: For an hotel of ten or more rooms and overnight cabin establishments of ten or more cabins, \$5.00; in the case of hotels and overnight cabins with lesser accommodation, \$3.00; in the case of tourist homes \$1.00. The fee for a restaurant license is \$3.00. All licenses to expire March 31 of each year.
