EDITOR'S MAIL.

PORK PRODUCTION AGAIN.

Sir,—My attention has, by the Farmer, been called to an article in The Guardian of the 2nd inst., dealing with the production of pork in this Province, and based on a recent interview on this most important subject which the editor had with a so-called "highly intelligent farmer." The conclusion reached by this agricultural savant, in which the editor readily coincides, is that profitable pork production has already about reached its limit in this Province! This seems to the writer—and it must strike the great majority of Island farmers in the same light to be a somewhat extraordinary position for a public adviser to assume—it sounds very much like preaching rank heresy, in an agricultural sense, to a provincial congregation through the medium of the press. To say that nothing produced on the farm except the wastes can be turned into pork with profit is to my mind the veriest absurdity. The interviewed farmer, backed up by The Guardian's able editorial pen, which could be otherwise much better employed, stands on ground utterly untenable when he claims that merchantable oats and potatoes cannot be profitably fed to hogs, even at the high prices prevailing for the latter to-day. If this be the kind of agricultural pabulum with which the farmer readers of The Guardian are to be regaled, the smaller the fish and the less frequent the treat the better for the community at large. Too long has this Province pursued an erratic course on the line of agricultural development—too long has the shipment of potatoes and oats been the main dependence of a majority of our farmers. A new era has happily been inaugurated and a new gospel has been preached to the farmers with great acceptance by Prof. Robertson and others. Under this new dispensation, the keynote of which is dairying and hog raising, the position of the agricultural class has been vastly improved during recent years, and a pity it is that even one journalist, whose mission it should be to educate the public mind on matters pertaining to the material welfare of our people, should practically advise those engaged in farming to continue in the old rut—a system which in years gone by nearly beggared a large proportion of them. The interviewed farmer should know, and the editor as well, that to further pursue the calling along this line and sell the products of the field in a raw state is a system utterly at variance with the best agricultural thought of the age, and if persevered in could only result in robbing the soil of all its fertility. It is now a recognized principle that agricultural operations can only be successfully carried on when no raw material is sold in its natural state. Every farmer should be a manufacturer in a small way, feeding his hay and his oats, his potatoes and his roots to his horses and his cattle and his sheep and his hogs and his poultry, thus fitting his stock to realize the highest market prices. It is only in this way that soil fertility can be maintained. We have a generous soil, quick to respond to proper treatment, but unless it be well fed agricultural operations can only result in signal failure. Barnyard manure must always remain with us the chief source of soil fertility, and a sufficient supply for this purpose can only be obtained by keeping live stock and feeding to the same everything produced on the farm. Notwithstanding the dictum of the Guardian, I claim that no class of animals can be brought to the slaughter more cheaply or more profitably than the hog, and at present prices hog production should be doubled or trebled within the next year or two to the great advantage of the whole country.
