Little Pon Fair
The School Fair which was held at Annandale on Wednesday, Sept. 14th, was largely attended and in every way proved successful. The schools that took part are as follows: Cumberland Hill, teacher, Miss Nellie McDonald; River View teacher, Miss Ada Power; Annandale, teacher, Miss Sadie Blasson; Little Pond, teacher, Miss Margaret McCormack; Howe Bay, teacher, Miss Annie Jenkins.
Although the exhibits were not as numerous as last year, the quality was much better. The school work and collections were superior to last year, both in quality and quantity. The exhibits of roots and vegetables, the competition was close, showing the careful selection made by the pupils.
An interesting feature of the Fair was the three minute speeches on Potato Growing, delivered by Misses Josephine Swallow and Emily McDonald, both pupils of Little Pond School.
The Inspector, Mr. Augustus Cairns under whose supervision the fair was carried on, was assisted in the judging by Miss Heleal Harper and Mr. Gordon McMillan. After the judging, remarks were passed on school fair work by the Hon. President, Mr. Smith Aftex, which Mr. Cairns congratulated both teachers and pupils on their successful fair. He spoke on the value of school fairs as an educational and agricultural work. Mr. McMillan and Miss Harper then followed with brief addresses on their respective lines of work. They expressed their satisfaction at the quality of the exhibition.
The meeting closed with the singing of "God Save The King," after which all went out doors to watch the interesting sports which were enjoyed by young and old. The prize list is as follows:
