**QUARTERLY REPORT  
OF THE GRAND WORTHY  
PATRIARCH OF S. O. T.**

To the Officers and Representatives of  
The Grand Division S.O.T. of P.E.  
Island at the Last Quarterly  
Session

The time has arrived in the history of  
our order that we must no longer "mark  
time". We have the law placed in our  
hands. It is a duty laid upon us, as law-  
abiding citizens, to see to it that the said  
law is strictly enforced. To do this effec-  
tively, we must keep in view the great  
dynamic force of "Moral Suasion". Legal  
enactment and moral suasion, like faith  
and works, must go hand in hand in the  
uprooting of this great curse, the Liquor  
Traffic. We must first have thorough  
organization within our ranks, and I  
would begin at once.

I would highly recommend that every  
subordinate Division, within our juris-  
diction, elect by ballot every year to the  
annual meeting, a Committee of five  
judicious members whose duties shall be  
to have an oversight of all matters affect-  
ing not only their own division but to  
take cognizance of all legislative proceed-  
ings. The said Committee to appoint a  
chairman and secretary both of whom  
shall be its executive. These executive  
members to report, at any time, to the  
executive of this Grand Division, through  
the G. W. F. all such matters as they  
shall deem it advisable to communicate.  
All such communications to be regarded  
and held as strictly confidential by the  
Grand Division.

Last summer it was intended to hold a  
Mammoth Temperance Demonstration,  
but the Committee were unable to perfect  
the necessary arrangements. I would  
suggest that at this session the Grand  
Division take the matter up and appoint  
a committee of management, who shall  
report at the evening session.

It is well known to the members of the  
order that the summer season has always  
been the most difficult time to hold our  
Divisions together. To overcome this, I  
would suggest that divisions follow along  
the same line, as we have been doing the  
past winter, viz: Group the divisions  
and hold social gatherings. At these  
social functions an opportunity is afford-  
ed to introduce pie social, basket ball, &c.,  
&c. By such methods I can see no rea-  
son why we should not keep up an inter-  
est at all times, and sustain a full  
membership.

I beg to call the attention of our mem-  
bership to the annual session of our  
National Division, which meets in July  
next, in the city of Halifax. I trust there  
will be a good representation from the  
Grand Division on that occasion. Re-  
duced fares over the Government Rail-  
ways will be given.

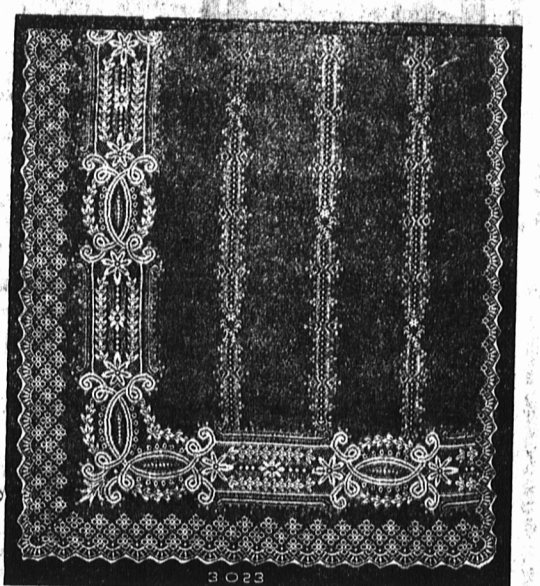

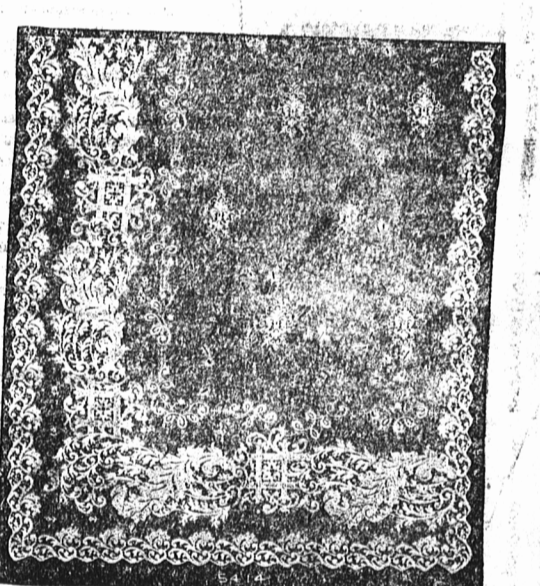
