UPSIDE-DOWN PUDDING (Banana and Chocolate)

It would be more convenient to steam your puddings, allow them 30 minutes over boiling water, and the puddings develop a delightful thin crisp top, which will help endure them when you use the oven.

Serve puddings immediately — the bananas shrink a little bit when allowed to stand.

36 1/4-inch-thick slices of banana
1 1/3 cups once-sifted cake flour
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
4 tablespoons cocoa
1/2 teaspoon salt
4 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup brown sugar, lightly packed
1/2 cup corn syrup
1 egg well beaten
1/4 teaspoon orange rind
1/2 cup buttermilk
1 teaspoon vanilla

On each of six greased individual baking dishes, arrange six slices of banana.

Measure and sift together three times, the flour, baking powder, baking soda, cocoa and salt.

Cream the shortening and gradually blend in the brown sugar; add the well-beaten egg, a little at a time; beat well after each addition; mix in orange rind, the buttermilk and vanilla.

Add the dry ingredients to the creamed mixture alternately with the flavored buttermilk, combining lightly after each addition.

Carefully turn batter into the prepared baking dishes.

Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees, about 30 minutes.

For serving, unmould the puddings, and serve with poaching sugar.
