BRITISH OFFICERS ARRESTED IN GERMANY

A despatch from Berlin says—One of the most interesting international trials of the age will begin in Leipzig. It will be a secret trial, one fraught with the gravest possibilities for the peace of Europe. It is the trial of the two Englishmen who were arrested in German territory on Aug. 21 on the charge of espionage. The British government has demanded to be represented at the trial. This demand has not been granted.

The identity of the prisoners is no longer a secret. They are Englishmen; they are officers in the service of the King of England, and they will be tried in uniform. One is Vivian Brandon, a lieutenant in the royal navy, the son of Mrs. Brandon, of Oakbrook, Hammersmith; the brother of Jocelyn Brandon, L. C. C., and brother-in-law of Sir William Bull, M. P., who has undertaken the conduct of the defence. Lieut. Brandon is also a first cousin of Lady Arthur, Mrs. Lewis Waller and Mrs. Clement Scott. Bernard Frederick Trench is a captain in the Royal Marine light infantry, and a member of a well known and distinguished Irish family, of which Lord Ashton was the head. Col. Trench, late British military attaché at Berlin, is his cousin, and his father is at present in chief control of the engineering department of the London & Northwestern Railway. The prisoners will be defended by Dr. Von Gordon, a prominent international lawyer of Berlin, and Dr. Hans Otto of Leipzig.

The German case is that on the night of Aug. 21 the lookout on the military watch tower at Borkum noticed a sudden flash of light, which was made plain owing to the intense darkness of the surroundings.

The alarm was given, and in a few minutes a brilliant searchlight was brought into action, and its rays showed the form of a dark figure crouching on ground strictly forbidden to civilians. The guard was turned out, and after they had

dangerous and it is to be hoped will be kept in custody in Germany for a very long time, with suitable intellectual distraction, in order that what they have seen may not remain all too clear and alive in their memories.

It should be added that no one has yet suggested that the two defendants procured more than could be added by a pair of intelligent eyes to the general staff maps and admiralty charts which are to be bought at any book shop.

The English expression "fair play" is being adopted into the German language, but its sense is as yet very imperfectly understood here.

A great outcry has also been raised as the result of timid and tentative semi-official hints at the fact that the German government has undertaken to favor in principle the presence of a representative of the British government at the Leipzig trial. In more than one journal the suggestion has been not only seriously, but vehemently, put forward that this was nothing but a trick with the object of obtaining possession of the information collected by defendants. The truth is, of course, that the military authorities will only have to declare that any particular portion of the evidence must be heard in camera for the interests of the country for the secrecy of that part of the trial to be made absolute. What the British diplomatic representative will hear will not be valuable military mysteries, but general evidence from which the public is usually excluded in espionage cases, for many and various reasons,

among them desire to keep out of the temptation and knowing how comparatively high are the wages of treachery.

The Lokalanzeiger publishes a statement which appears to emanate from an authoritative source to the effect that the chancellor would have no objection to recommending the judicial authorities concerned to consider favorably Great Britain's request. The court would itself have the right to exclude such a representative when evidence of a secret nature was about to be given.

The Tageszeitung protests vigorously against the suggestion that a British representative should be allowed privileges which would have been gladly allowed to a German representative in the case of Lieut. Helm.

"A German representative at the Helm trial," says the journal, "would only have heard things which he could have learned more cheaply and with less trouble by buying picture postcards of Portsmouth, while a British representative at the trial of the Borkum espionage case might get a glance into the whole extensive material of the British spies, and by this means obtain possession of important results of their activity."

He interviewed the authorities at Emden, and a few hours later, in accordance with orders from high quarters, he was arrested.
