THE convention of Nova Scotia Sunday School workers recently held in Dartmouth was very successful. The attendance by two prominent Sunday school workers from the United States who had visited the convention held in Charlottetown P. E. Island, was one of the features that gave great interest to the meetings and left a deep impression on those who attended the various sessions. This is good work and will be followed by good results.

It is apparent that there are other places besides Charlottetown where fire crackers, etc., are carelessly used during the hour of celebration. The Toronto Globe contains the following dated November 7th:—Cannon fire crackers are to be suppressed if His Worship the Mayor can do it. Yesterday he received from Dr. Newburn, St. Patrick street, a letter, in which he said:—"Women's faces and men's hands are too valuable to be ruined by the confounded idiot who possesses a giant firecracker. We had specimens yesterday of what the fool can do, and to-morrow we will have the same unless you put your foot down. Can you not order the police to arrest every fellow found with one either lighted or not? And can you not have a by-law passed making the sale or possession of these infernal nuisances an illegal act? And when you are about to make the act include small fire crackers as well as large." The Mayor stated that he would introduce a prohibitory by-law.

THE Windsor Journal in referring to the return of the boys in khaki says:—A patriotic address was delivered by the Rev. S. Weston Jones, at one time rector of St. Paul's church, Charlottetown, one of the best we have ever heard him deliver, in which he travelled back to the period when the country to the South of us was a part of the British Empire to show that the same loyalty which led the young men whom we are now honoring to leave home and friends to fight for the flag in South Africa, was identical with the same loyalty which inspired so many in the olden time to remain true to King and country, and eventually led them to come to Canada and Nova Scotia after the declaration of Independence—the forefathers of our country. The Rev. speaker said that when President Kruger flung down his impudent ultimatum and ordered the British troops to leave the country, it sent a thrill throughout the Empire, in Canada, in Nova Scotia, in was hard to restrain the impetuosity, the tugging at the harness, the pulling at the bit, as it were, to resent the insult to Queen and country, and many very many, like the fine fellows before us, demanded to be sent out to South Africa to uphold the Majesty of the Queen and the glory of the Empire. He said we ought to honor the names of the brave fellows who now stood before us—we should teach them to our children, and they again to their children, men whose deeds would grace the annals of Greece, and Rome, and of Great Britain. The speaker referred to the names of illustrious men—Brook and others who so nobly defended the Nation's interests; Kingsmen had had his heroes in the battle field, for Kingsmen were always loyal to the British Crown (great cheering from the K. C. Students) and Blanchard and Hensley were names that should never be forgotten, and we should see to it that in this locality we have a memorial by which they shall be substantially remembered for all time to come. This is only the merest outline of a splendid address, which elicited frequent cheering.
