## BRITISH CITIZENS

A Steady Immigration Expected From

### IRELAND AND WALES

There Will Not be as Large Influx of Such Settlers as Doukhobors.

Mr. James A. Smart, Deputy Minister of Interior, who recently returned from a trip to Europe, made while there a thorough investigation of the question of immigration to Canada and the chances for next summer's work.

Among the matters into which he looked was that of assisting the passages of such settlers from the British Isles as the government especially desires to see taking up land in the western country, but who yet need help up to a certain extent to enable them to make the change. Mr. Smart is in favor of such a policy in the cases of British settlers who need it and has so expressed himself to the Minister of the Interior so that there is a possibility of action in this line being taken.

The matter has been brought up in parliament at the last few sessions and urged upon the government. At present no such assistance is authorized except such as has been found absolutely necessary in the cases of Doukhobors and others, and which has been given only as a loan. The assisted passages would be designed with the idea of inducing more British emigrants to come to this country.

It is not expected that there will be next season any such large influx of settlers as the Doukhobors, but the tide will be steady and there is an expectation that the year 1900 will see increases in the number of settlers sent to Canada from the British Isles and especially from Ireland and Wales.

Mr. Smart's observation taught him that the work of Mr. Charles R. Devin in Ireland has not been without its fruit, and that next summer should see quite a number of his compatriots crossing to Canadian shores.

W. A. McCallum, formerly of Lot 48, P. E. I., but now of Minburne, Iowa, has just taken 197 young cattle from the Island to his western farm. He has 10,000 bushels surplus of corn for feed, and could not get cattle near his home. Corn is a great crop, while cattle for feeding purposes are scarce and high.—St. John Sun.

### BIG DIAMOND SMUGGLING.

Twenty Thousand Dollars' Worth Smuggled From Canada to States.

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—Deputy Collector Phelps today confirmed the report that diamonds valued at thousands of dollars, and which had been smuggled into this country, had been seized by the Government agents. The value of the stones is believed to be not far from \$20,000. Secret service agents had their suspicions aroused by hearing of stones having been offered to Maiden Lane jewellers at low prices. United States Treasury Agent Theobald called at the Grand Union Hotel yesterday on a man registered as Adolphe Peabody. Later the two went before Collector Bidwell. It is asserted that the secret service agents believe the diamonds to have been smuggled into this country from Canada.
