P. A. McINTYRE, Lieut. Governor A PROCLAMATION

By His Honour PETER ADOLPHUS McINTYRE, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Prince Edward Island, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued until Tuesday, the Eighteenth day of December, next.

I have thought fit, by and with the advice and consent of Her Majesty's Executive Council of this Province, to dissolve the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby dissolved accordingly.

And I do hereby give notice to the members for the several Electoral Districts and Towns and Royalities, within the said Province that they are hereby discharged from further attendance in the said Legislative Assembly.

And I do further declare that I have given orders, that writs calling a Legislative Assembly be issued in due form, the said writs to bear date the Fourteenth day of November, instant, and to be returnable on Wednesday, the Second day of January, A. D. 1901, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Province, at Charlottetown, in the said Province, this Thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred, and in the Sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
