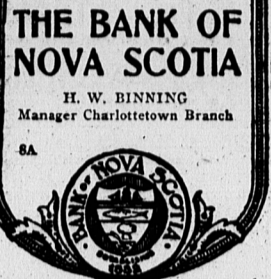

Brave Indian Soldiers Write to Parish Priest

Father John M. McDonald, Grand River, Lot 14 has received the following letter which is of interest to everyone.

26th Can Batt. France Wednesday, May 15, 1918

Dear Father John:—James Sark and I are sitting at present in the front yard of a little home in a ruined French Village, not far from the Front Line. The guns (our own guns) are booming around us and now and then Fritz sends over a few shells but, beyond that we are fairly safe and are surrounded by some apple trees, lilac, and other shrubs in bloom.

Joseph Tuplin, Dennis Lewis, John Mitchell are in my platoon in the 26th Battalion. All these boys are a credit to themselves, to their Parish and their loved Island Home.

Sark and I were speaking of you last night or night before and were saying how much you would like to be with us, and if we ever get home that you would "kill" your best goose (even two geese) for us and give us a real Father John welcome—so decided to write a letter to you today while sitting out here in the sun.
