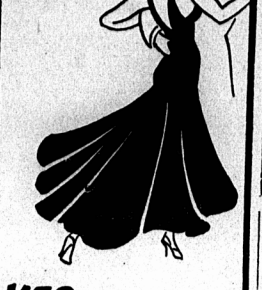

THE PRIORITY OF GOD

If a religion declares itself in its priorities, the heart of Christianity is revealed in the supreme place which is ascribed to God. The first and greatest of the Christian priorities is the priority of God. Christianity is a religion for man and about man, but its distinction is that it is this because it is from God and about God. Man's place in Christianity is the relation of the created being to his creator, revealed as the God and Father who invites him to live as a son under the roof-tree of His love. Man's true life is life eternal through the knowledge of God. Life divorced from God is death, for man separated from God has violated the basic laws of his being, and apart from God all his self-centred cultural growths and social orders are doomed to break up and perish. God is the true centre of the world man lives in and of every individual life in it. Man-centredness is sin and in an inexorable sequence it destroys him. Secular humanism, on the contrary, sets man in the centre of the stage. This worldly in essence, it is concerned only with man's temporal welfare and earth-bound culture. Its Utopias, therefore, are founded upon man as the measure of all things, the measure of God. In the less extreme forms of humanism, which tolerate the idea of God and use much Christian language while rejecting the Christian essentials, the relation of the first to the second great commandment is confused; and practically, if not in theory, the love of God becomes definitely secondary to the love of man. The result is a strange travesty of the teaching of our Lord. To Him the good news of His new age is the arrival of the Rule of God in His Kingdom, whose "first and great commandment" is "thou shalt love the Lord thy God." The love of neighbor is indissolubly united with this as the inevitable consequence of loving God who is love. Love of man is the overflow of love of God; it is fruit from that root. While humanism seeks first its good things, material, physical, and cultural, the call of Christ is consistently to seek first the kingdom in which life eternal is fulfilled in life eternal. Always and in all things there is manifest the priority of God.

To the convinced Christian this is the truth of the spirit, whose familiarity tends to dull his sense of awareness. Truths, even the most venerable and vital, lose their power unless they are constantly seen

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again as if for the first time. To transform what thus inclines to become truism into dynamic truth, ruin by untruths about God and about man, is of urgent importance both for Church and world. The humanist who sincerely seeks the man's well-being and finds that the downward drag of evil continually defeats him, if he is to escape frustration, must needs humble himself to learn from Jesus, Son of Man and Son of God.

COFFEE SPICE LAYER CAKE
 1/2 cup shortening
 2 eggs, separated 2/3 cup sugar
 2 cups sifted cake flour
 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 1 teaspoon nutmeg
 1/2 cup strong coffee
 Cream shortening and sugar thoroughly add egg yolks and beat well. Sift all dry ingredients twice. Add alternately with coffee to cream mixture.

Beat in greased layer cake pans at 350 degrees F. for 30 minutes.

Price Control Questions and Answers

Questions and Answers on Price Control will appear in the Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from business men in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. Persons who have interesting questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the War Time Prices and Trade Board.

Q. Can you please tell me exactly how much less sugar we'll be getting under the new arrangement when two sugar coupons come due every third Tuesday of the month, instead of every four weeks?
 A. Yes, it will mean two pounds a year less to every Canadian consumer.

Q. I understood that under the Emergency Housing Regulations sub-letting in the house would be discontinued. Yes, I know of an apartment sub-let only this week. Are people allowed to do this?
 A. There is nothing to stop people sub-letting as long as the party they sub-let to has obtained a permit or an authorization from the Emergency Shelter Registry.

Q. In anticipation of the arrival of my bride from England, I bought a house. In the meantime her passage has been delayed and I would like to rent the house until she gets here. Must I have the rent set when I am only renting for a short period?
 A. If there is not already a tenancy in possession you must apply to the Rentals Administration for a rental fixation. When the fixation is completed an appraisal will call and inspect your property and set the maximum rental you may charge. However, if there is a tenancy living in the house now the rental must remain the same.

Q. It seems to me that some retailers are using the scarcity of dates as an excuse to charge too much for them. I paid 25c a lb. in one store and 30c in another. Is there no price ceiling on dates?
 A. You were definitely overcharged for the dates you bought. The maximum price at which bulk dates can be sold is 24c a lb. in Charlottetown.
